PRELIMINARIES

Chair Garrido recognized President Armstrong who welcomed everyone to the March Board of Trustees meeting. The pledge of allegiance was lead by the students present.

Donna Henderson introduced the faculty in attendance. Dr. Angelia Millender introduced students in attendance including Buzz Lamb from The Observer. Ms. Jillian Printz stated there were no other media present.

PRELIMINARIES

RECOGNITION OF "TAKE STOCK IN CHILDREN"

President Armstrong introduced Executive Director of the BCC Foundation Nancy Botero and Chairman of the BCC Foundation Board of Directors Lloyd Rhodes. Mr. Rhodes introduced members of "Take Stock in Children," including State President Mike Weinstein. Mr. Weinstein discussed the goals of the program, including the commitment to student learning, student success and establishing a scholarship fund. Mr. Weinstein indicated there was a 92 percent success rate in this program, and a total of approximately 15,000 students from the State of Florida who participated in the program, the majority of whom continued their postsecondary education at a community college. There was a ceremonial signing of a check for \$117,000 that will be used to establish a scholarship fund. There was a presentation of a certificate to the Board of Trustee members and to President Armstrong, who thanked Mr. Weinstein for his work and partnership with BCC.

RECOGNITION OF DECA WINNERS

President Armstrong called Dr. Barbara Bryan to the podium. Dr. Bryan presented some background regarding DECA and introduced Professor Paul Ricker, the student adviser to the DECA program. Professor Ricker gave a brief summary of the program. He then introduced the students who had received awards at the recent state competition in Orlando, where BCC had received 3 first place awards, 3 second place awards, 5 third place awards and had 15 finalists. Professor Ricker expressed his gratitude to the Board for support of the DECA program and indicated that ten DECA members were going to the national competition in Atlanta.
