

As an authorized Training Center, the Institute of Public Safety offers six certificate of achievement programs: The Broward County Police Academy Basic Recruit Certificate Program, The Broward County Correctional Officer Academy Basic Recruit Certificate Program, The Broward County Correctional Probation Officer Academy Certificate Program, Law Enforcement Officer-crossover from Correction Officer Certificate Program, and the Police Service Aide Certificate Program.

A person must be hired or sponsored by a corrections or law enforcement agency before being enrolled in any of these certificate programs. For further information on these certificate programs, contact the Testing Center at the Institute of Public Safety at (954) 201-6931.

Upon successful completion of the Law Enforcement Officer-crossover from Correctional Officer program, a currently certified Corrections Officer is eligible to take the state certification exam to become a certified Florida Law Enforcement Officer.
