## GENERAL STATEMENT

Consistent with Florida Statutes, the President or his/her designee are hereby authorized to enforce parking regulations, and collect transportation access fees and issue citations for parking violations on all locations of Broward Community-College. Monies collected from parking violations are to be deposited in the student scholarship accounts for student financial aid recipients at the College. Transportation access fees are to be used for parking lot, walkway, road, crosswalk maintenance, security, and student transportation needs. The municipal police authority at each College site shall provide enforcement of state and local traffic ordinances. The President is authorized to issue any needed procedures to implement this policy.

**Removal of Vehicles.** The President is authorized to develop procedures consistent with *Florida Statutes*, Chapter 715.05 and 715.07 and appropriate state regulations for the towing of vehicles from College locations.

## THE POLICY and THE STUDENT

This policy is devised to provide adequate and secure vehicle parking lots and to enhance the overall safety of pedestrians in parking areas, walkways, roads, and crosswalks. Fine proceeds benefit student scholarship accounts for student financial aid recipients at the College.

## THE POLICY and THE FACULTY AND STAFF.

To provide adequate and secure vehicle parking lots and to enhance the overall safety of pedestrians in parking areas, walkways, roads, and crosswalks.

## IMPLEMENTATION and OVERSIGHT

The President has the authority to establish procedures to implement this policy. The VP for Facilities and Campus Provosts have the responsibility for the implementation and oversight of this policy.

## VIOLATION OF POLICY

All individuals in violation of these established policies may be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination.
