



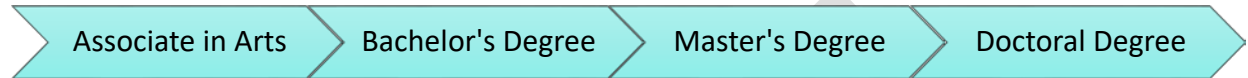
Social Work Transfer Plan – Associate of Arts 1010
