

Broward College History

Supporting the growth of the communities they serve is uniquely part of Florida’s publicly supported community colleges.

In 1957, Florida embarked on a program to create a network of colleges to provide the freshman and sophomore years of instruction to prepare students for transfer to upper-division colleges, or to complete associate in science degree programs. There, Floridians could complete their first two years at quality, affordable institutions located within 30 miles of 95 percent of the state’s population. In 1959, Broward County was approved and planning for the Junior College of Broward County began.

Work began on the campus in 1960. The first buildings were completed for the start of classes in autumn 1963. The first class, 701 students, started classes at the former Naval Air Station Junior High School under the direction of President Joe B. Rushing. In August 1963, the first seven buildings on the 152-acre campus in Davie opened for the college’s 2,500 students.

In 1965, Dr. Rushing announced he planned to return to Texas. Chosen to succeed him was Dr. Myron Blee, who served for one year. After his departure, Dr. A. Hugh Adams was hired as president and led the college for 18 years.

The JCBC and Florida's other public junior colleges were first governed by county boards of public instruction. They also received guidance from an appointed advisory board. In 1968, shortly after the college changed its name to Broward Junior College, the State Legislature transformed the advisory boards into district boards of trustees.

In 1970, the college underwent another name change – to Broward Community College.

Dr. Adams led the college from 1968 to 1986, guiding its growth in size, scope and prestige. During his tenure, BCC expanded to begin South Campus in 1968, North Campus in 1970, the Downtown Center in 1973 and the Tigertail Lake Watersports Center in 1975.

Programmatic growth also was readily evident during the Adams years. Law enforcement and corrections officers were originally educated by the School Board of Broward County, but in 1972, the program moved into the new Criminal Justice Institute on Central Campus. The Aviation Institute opened in 1982 and that same year, construction began on the BCC/South Regional Library, a groundbreaking partnership between the college and the Broward County Library System.

Dr. Adams retired in 1986. To honor his dedication, service and accomplishments, the trustees named Central Campus the A. Hugh Adams Central Campus in December 1986.

Dr. Willis N. Holcombe, who had served in many roles at Broward before becoming vice president at Brevard Community College, was named Broward's fourth president. He continued the college's physical expansion program, particularly in the areas of libraries and

student services facilities. Dr. Holcombe also was a bridge builder in the community. He created community partnerships with Broward Health, Broward County Public Schools, Florida Atlantic University, Florida International University and others.

Under Dr. Adams, the college had created the first partnership in the state between a library system and a community college, with the creation of the BCC/South Regional Library, which opened in June 1983. That partnership grew under Dr. Holcombe, with the opening of the BCC/North Regional Library in June 1994. A similar partnership at the Pines Center opened in July 2000.

Another focus of Dr. Holcombe's presidency was international education. Under his direction, BCC became a leader in the field, serving as a consultant to countries looking to establish community college systems, establishing presence on selected campuses worldwide, becoming an active participant in the College Consortium for International Studies and establishing ties with colleges throughout the world.

Dr. Holcombe led the college from 1987 until his retirement in 2004. The BCC District Board of Trustees hired Dr. Larry A. Calderon, president of Ventura College, as the college's fifth president. Under Calderon, BCC partnered with Junior Achievement to construct JA World on North Campus, dedicated the Performing & Cultural Arts Theater on South Campus and broke ground for a new LEED-certified South Regional/Broward Community College Library. In February 2006, the Weston Center opened and was immediately embraced by citizens of southwestern Broward.

Dr. Calderon left Broward College in October 2006 and the District Board of Trustees asked Dr. Holcombe to serve as president while a national search took place.

J. David Armstrong, Jr. was named the college's sixth president and left his position as chancellor of the Florida Community College System to accept the Broward presidency. Dr. Holcombe was asked by the Commissioner of Education to serve as interim chancellor in his place. Dr. Holcombe later accepted a permanent appointment as chancellor.

On February 19, 2008, the Florida Board of Education approved Broward's application to offer Bachelor of Science degrees in Education in critical workforce need areas -- middle grades mathematics and general science, secondary biology and mathematics and exceptional student education. Three months later Gov. Charlie Crist signed the legislation to change the college's name to Broward College. Broward College was officially approved by the Commission on Colleges as a Level II institutional on November 2008. The first class of baccalaureate students began attending classes in January 2009 on the Samuels South Campus.

Broward College opened another partnership center in September 2008, collaborating with the county, the City of Miramar and Nova Southeastern University on the Miramar Library and Education Center, located in the Miramar Town Center.

As Broward College approaches the start of its second half-century of service, it serves the same service area – Broward County – as it did when it first opened its doors. However, our community has transformed into one of the most densely populated, and widely culturally diverse urban areas in the country. That is reflected in the college's student body – with students in our Winter Term II, 2009 who are citizens of the United States and 151 foreign nations. (Appendix 1) In the May 2009 commencement exercises, students from 97 foreign countries graduated from the college. Part time students comprised more than two-thirds of

BC enrollment during Fall Term I, 2008. In addition, these fall term students were approximately 60% female. The average age of BC students during this term was 27 with a median age of 23. Hispanic students accounted for 31% of the Fall Term I, 2008 enrollment as did Non-Hispanic Caucasian students, with Non-Hispanic Black students at a similar percentage with 29%. (Appendix 2)

Broward College Characteristics

Broward College is a diverse, comprehensive institution dedicated to maintaining the vitality and viability of its communities and its service to the citizens of Broward County, Florida. Despite the fiscal challenges of a soft economy, the college retains its longtime commitment to open admissions and seeks to serve the needs of its communities through programs that prepare its students for upper-division study and to meet critical workforce needs. Among them are associate degree programs in nursing (which was first offered in 1963) and allied health sciences, to aviation, marine technology and bachelor's degree programs in education.

Over its history, Broward College has defined its expanding role in the community by updating its mission statement. With the college's transition to a Level II institution, its trustees, administration, faculty, staff and students have worked to craft a mission statement that reflects its new role. It is:

"The mission of Broward College is to achieve student success by developing informed and creative students capable of contributing to a sustainable knowledge- and service-based global society. As a public community college accredited to offer associate degrees, selected baccalaureate degrees, and certificate programs, the institution and its District Board of Trustees are committed to fostering a learning-centered community that celebrates diversity and inclusion by empowering and engaging students, faculty, and staff."

In April, 2009 a substantive change prospectus was submitted to report three new off-campus sites established since the college's last reaffirmation. Approval of this substantive change proposal by the Commission on Colleges is pending. The **Weston Center** and **Miramar Town Center** were created to provide access to higher education to the citizens of west Broward County. The centers offer a full range of general education courses that fulfill associate degree requirements. Courses are taught through traditional face-to-face instruction as well as a blended format (partially face-to-face and partially online). In addition, the Miramar Town Center also offers the coursework required for the Associate in Applied Science Degree in Air Traffic Control. The **Automotive and Marine Training Center** offers the specific technical training and coursework required for the Associate in Science degree in Automotive Technology and Marine Engineering Management. Students enrolled in these programs of study can take the general education course requirements at the South campus. The **Center for American Education at Broward College of Ecuador** located at Brookdale College of Ecuador has existed in Guayaquil, Ecuador since 1985 but joined the BC international education programs officially on January 1, 2007 as the Center for American Education at Broward College of Ecuador (BCE). In August, 2007, with permission from the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, CAE Ecuador began to offer

BC courses and credits as an accredited overseas campus of BC. Students attending CAE Ecuador can earn more than 50% of the credits toward an Associate in Arts Degree. The **American College of Higher Education** (pending approval, fall 2009) in Columbo, Sri Lanka began in 1998 and has grown steadily each year to a total of 350 students. There are also over 200 students in the K-12 system leading to the American College of Higher Education program affiliated with BC. Broward College plans to offer more than 50% of the credits needed for an AA degree at ACHE.

Broward College submitted a Request for Substantive Change for electronic delivery of degrees and certificates on September 10, 2007. The College sought approval to offer associate degrees and certificates through asynchronous distance education delivery to sanction current e-Learning activities as well as those emerging from ongoing online program development. The Commission on Colleges approved Broward's proposal on June 18, 2008. Included in the description for change were the Associate of Arts, the Associate of Science and the Associate of Applied Science Degrees, and Certificate programs.

Broward offers 160 different courses online during an academic year. For the winter term II, 2009, 7,362 students enrolled in 286 sections. A substantial majority of these students resided in three south Florida counties: Broward (82%) Miami Dade (10%) and Palm Beach (2%). Five percent resided in other Florida counties and less than one percent lived outside Florida.
