What's new for 2010-11

This year we are offering eight sections with exciting new sessions: Ortho, Oral Surgery Didactic, Oral Surgery Clinic, Esthetics/Fixed Prosth, Endo, Implant, Perio, and Prosth.

Programs presented by the **Broward Dental Research Clinic** are approved by the Florida Board of Dentistry programs and the Academy of General Dentistry for continuing education credit.

The Broward Dental Research Clinic has been designated an approved Program Provider by the Florida Constituent of Academy of General Dentistry. This Program Provider's formal CDE programs are accepted by the AGD for membership maintenance, Fellowship and Mastership credit. The current term of approval extends from July 18, 2010 to July 17, 2014. The approval of sponsors does not imply endorsement by the Academy of General Dentistry of course content, products, or therapies presented. The participant must make the decision as to the merit and applicability of the material to which he/she is exposed.



Membership

Any Florida licensed dentist is eligible to apply for membership in the **Broward Dental Research Clinic**.

It is required that each applicant carry professional liability insurance (\$250,000/500,000). Membership is contingent upon approval by the Board of Directors, receipt of annual dues and proof of insurance. All new members are requested to complete an application form. New and existing members must fill out the annual COURSE SELECTION FORM. Application of membership may be submitted at any time throughout the year.

Course Format

Morning sessions: 9 am-noon

Afternoon sessions: 1-4 pm; unless otherwise indicated.

Specific dates and times are provided for the sections' sessions. Members have the option to select from all the sections. There are potential clinical sessions depending upon objectives and desires of each group. Some sessions have one hour of didactic before a two hour clinical session. It is highly successful when participants bring in their own patients. There are many different options - choose the one best for you.

Courses:

Prosthodontics – Hands on

Lecture discussion/Clinic. "The joys of removable prosthodontics and all those questions you were afraid to ask" with Bob Selz. A straight forward approach to the diagnosis, treatment planning, design and construction of removable complete and partial dentures.

Members are offered half-day sessions providing them up to 3 CE's for each session. It will be the group and the member's option to participate in a clinical component. Members have the option of inviting a patient from their practice for the clinicals or patients will be provided. Patients from the member's practice receive the benefit of reduced-cost dental work. At the member's discretion, treatment can be completed at the office or the clinic.
