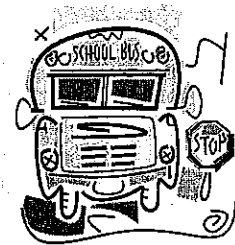

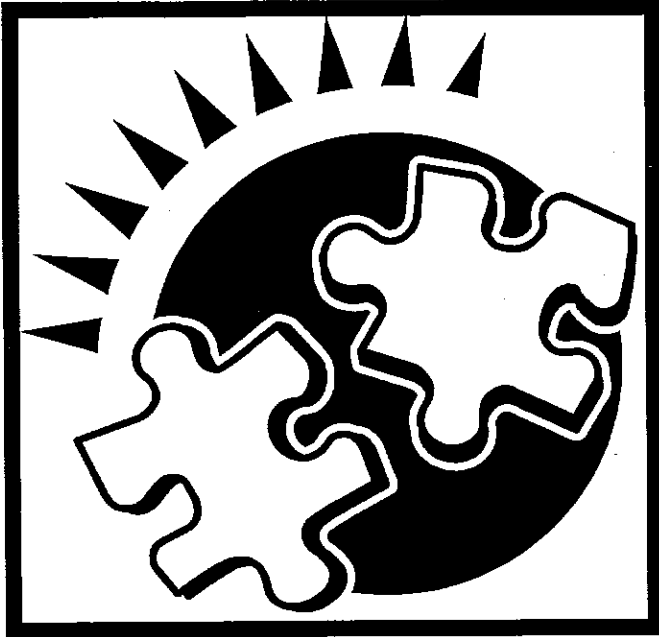

The C.D.A. (Child Development Associate) credential is a nationally recognized credential certifying competence in the field of Early Childhood Education. Individuals holding the CDA credential meet the current requirements for Child Care personnel in the State of Florida.

STEPS TO TAKE

COURSEWORK

Complete the three (3) following Early Childhood Education courses:

- EEC 1200 Early Childhood Education
- EEC 1603 Child Guidance
- CHD 1320 Curriculum Planning

EXPERIENCE

Document 480 hours of current experience working with children from birth to 5 years in a childcare setting.

PROFESSIONAL RESOURCE FILE

Document your competence and expertise working with young children. Students can do this independently or by enrolling in the appropriate non-credit class at Broward College.

OBSERVATION

Students must also have an Advisor complete a classroom observation of them. This can be done independently or through the college.

THE ASSESSMENT PROCESS

Application packets are available for \$23 (plus \$5.00 shipping and handling) and provide instructions for Candidates to prepare for assessment. These are sent to the Council for Professional Recognition in Washington, DC, which directs the National CDA Credentialing Process. Contact the Council at 1-800-424-4310 to purchase an application packet, or visit their website at <http://www.cdacouncil.org> (the Council is in the process of developing an on-line application process). They will send a representative to administer a test and interview. On successful completion of the process, a National CDA Credential will be issued. The initial CDA Credential is valid for a period of three years. Subsequent renewals are required every five years.

FLORIDA CDA WAIVER EXEMPTION

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

1. COLLEGE DEGREE

- You must have a 2-year, a 4-year, or an advanced college degree in a field other than early childhood education, elementary education, or consumer science.
- If your degree was earned outside the United States, you must submit an official evaluation from an accredited evaluation service stating that your degree is the equivalent to a 2-year or 4-year degree in the U.S.

2. WORK EXPERIENCE

You must have completed 480 hours of experience working with children birth through eight years of age in the last five years.

3. EARLY CHILDHOOD COURSEWORK

You must have completed two early childhood college credit courses. At Broward College, these courses are offered each term and are:

- EEC 1200 Early Childhood Education
- CHD 1320 Curriculum Planning

FLORIDA RESIDENCY INFORMATION

TRANSCRIPTS REQUIREMENTS

- Out of Country graduates must provide proof of High School Graduation prior to admissions. College transcripts must be evaluated and translated by Joseph Silny or World Education Services.
- Transcripts must be evaluated within 30 days of student's initial term
- All domestic students are required to provide *official transcripts* (in a sealed envelope from former school(s) within 30 days to the registration/admissions office at:

2009-2010 Professional Development Scholarships Available Now!

Eligibility: Applicants must work in Broward County child care centers or family child care homes serving children receiving financial assistance from School Readiness. Priority will be given to applicants working in sites participating in the Quality Rating and Improvement System. The number of scholarships to be awarded is subject to the availability of funds.

➤ National CDA Credential Program

Available to applicants who enroll in and agree to complete 120 hours of formal early childhood education coursework offered by a State approved educational institution and leading to completion and/or application of a CDA National credential. All scholarships will be provided to employees of Broward County Child Care Centers and Family Child Care Homes serving children receiving financial assistance from School Readiness with priority given to recipients participating in ELC4, a **Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS)** which is a County-wide, multi-agency effort to determine and advance the quality of early care and education. May also apply for national application or observation scholarship.

➤ Early Childhood College-Credit Courses

Applicants will be reimbursed upon completion of pre-approved early care and education college course at an accredited institution. (Maximum 2 per semester if degree seeking – 1 every 5 years if non-degree seeking – 1 scholarship if already holding a degree)

All applications and required documentation must be received two weeks before class starts.

➤ In-service workshops/CEU's

Applicants will be reimbursed upon completion of up to 10 hours of in-service workshops or CEU but not to exceed \$100.00.

All applications and required documentation must be received two weeks before class starts.

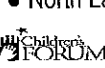
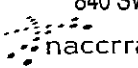
