PROJECT BUSINESS CASE

Project Overview

The General Education Task Force recommended that the one credit technology literacy general education course requirement be eliminated. Replacing the course is a requirement that students take and pass a basic technology literacy assessment. Students not passing the assessment would be required to remediate deficiencies.

After reviewing several implementation options, the VPAA supports the administration of an international basic tech literacy exam (IC3) through Certiport, which will administer and host the exam. Students will take the exam in BCC testing centers. This change requires several CID changes.

- Exam results will need to be exported from the Certiport servers into the individual student accounts in CID.
- Students who have completed 12 hours of college credit would not be allowed to enroll in additional courses without having satisfied the basic technology literacy requirement.
