- Complete and submit the application. Priority will be given to students who are returning to BC for at least one term of study after their placement.
- Attend Mandatory Orientation January 6, 2012 9:00AM—12:00PM. Location: WHC Room TBA
- Have completed at least 24 college level credits at Broward College.
- Be a student in good standing.
- Have a minimum of 3.0 cumulative GPA.
- Be 18 years of age or older by January 6, 2012.
Not Eligible: BC College Academy or Dual Enrolled high school students.
- Be available for and committed to the entirety of the course including class sessions taking place before, during, and after the trip to Peru.
- Be eligible for a Passport to travel to Peru.

Broward College will subsidize this one-time opportunity for a limited number of qualified students by paying airfare and housing in exchange for service work in Peru during Spring break, March 2012.



Cusco, Peru

The District of Huillcapata is located outside of Cusco.

The 2011 census report shows 157 resident families. Of the 116 children residing in the town, 71 attend school. The level of illiteracy is 38%.

The municipality of Cusco works with the town as part of a program called "Vaso de Leche" or "Glass of Milk", providing food and drink to students who attend school.



Broward College students will work with the community to refurbish and provide kitchen supplies for a rural high school in the area, Comunidad Campesina de Huillcapata



Course participants may be expected to climb ladders, maneuver on unpaved or cobblestone streets and/or surfaces, and travel on buses and trains.

The altitude in Cusco is approximately 11,000 feet. Individuals normally living at altitudes close to sea level may experience difficulty at high altitudes.

SLS 1261 Leadership

The purpose of this course is to provide effective leadership skills for student leaders to help them develop an ethical, value grounded leadership style for future educational, organizational and community leadership roles. This particular section will focus on the role of leadership in the promotion of social justice through service-learning in an international setting.

- Identify leadership roles, theories, and styles
- Recognize components of ethical leadership
- Demonstrate an understanding of the interrelatedness of the global community
- Develop the ability to create coalitions for the promotion of social justice
- Effectively solve problems and make decisions
- Demonstrate effective communication and active listening
- Effectively work in groups and plan projects
