- 2.4 The learner will assess for the need and implement hygiene care and provide for basic elimination while maintaining safety and medical asepsis, with respect to individual differences in age and cultural background.
- 2.5 The learner will assess and maintain a safe patient care environment, and intervene for patient care in a manner protective of safety of both the nurse and the patient by practicing the principles of body mechanics and principles of infection control.
- 2.6 The learner will be able to state the nursing actions appropriate for patient safety in the event of a fire in a health care agency.
- 2.7 The learner will be able to perform a complete basic health assessment, including patient history and physical, to establish a database for nursing process.
- 2.8 The student will begin to utilize the nursing process to plan, deliver and evaluate care for selected patients.
- 2.9 The learner will begin to assess the patient's fluid and electrolyte status and acid-base balance and begin to utilize the data obtained within the framework of the nursing process to plan, implement, and evaluate care for the patient.
