Upon successful completion of this unit, the student shall be able to: continue to build and refine the knowledge base formed in NUR 1020L, applying the concepts of holism, critical thinking, and community, utilizing the nursing process for safe and effective administration of medications, and assessing and planning nursing care for patients unable to meet basic human needs: nutrition, oxygenation, mobility, elimination, fluid and electrolyte and acid/base balance.

- 2.1 The learner will assess and monitor the effects of drug therapy.**
- 2.2 The learner will utilize nursing process to assess, plan, and collaborate in nursing care for patients at risk for or experiencing alterations in specified basic human needs: nutrition, oxygenation, mobility, fluid and electrolyte, and acid/ base balance.**
- 2.3 The learner will prepare and administer medications to patients via various routes following school, agency, and legal parameters.**
- 2.4 The learner will participate in the administration of blood and blood products.**
- 2.5 The learner will implement the nursing process to provide nutritional care for the patient, collaborating with the health care team and incorporating cultural sensitivity.**
- 2.6 The learner will implement the nursing process to assess and plan nursing care for patients unable to meet basic human need of urinary elimination.**
- 2.7 The learner will implement the nursing process to assess and plan nursing care for patients unable to meet basic human need of bowel elimination.**
- 2.8 The learner will implement the nursing process to assess and plan nursing care for patients unable to meet basic human need of oxygenation.**
