Unit 1. 1. ASSESSMENT OF CHILDREN AND THEIR FAMILIES IN THE ACUTE CARE SETTING

- 1.3 Implement nursing care to the hospitalized child including any cultural, social, or religious beliefs that impact health care.
- 1.4 Identify a teaching need of the pediatric patient and family incorporating assessment findings.
- 1.5 Evaluate and maintain a safe environment for the hospitalized child.
- 1.6 Determine safe dosage and administer medications and intravenous therapy
- 1.7 Determine nursing interventions related to the child's diagnosis and developmental stage.
