What is a Student Ambassador?

Student Ambassadors are enthusiastic, informed and responsible Broward College students who are available to assist our college community and prospective students in the transition from high school or work to Broward College.



Criteria

1. Students must be currently enrolled in classes at Broward College.
2. Students must have a minimum 2.5 GPA.
3. Students must be enrolled in a minimum of six credits.

Responsibilities

1. Conducting campus tours
2. Canvassing campus during peak registration to assist students and prospective students in finding appropriate information
3. Facilitating one-on-one sessions with students requiring assistance
4. Assisting with the daily operations of the Center for Inclusion
5. Assisting admissions recruiters with visiting area schools and other off-campus sites
6. Assisting with New Student Orientations
