LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear District Board of Trustees, Seahawk Family,
and our Broward Community,

A truly great institution does not simply react to the shifting landscape of higher education; it deliberately shapes it. Over the past year, Broward College has embraced a spirit of intentional modernization, building on our rich history of student-centered service while establishing a more agile, high-performance model for regional impact. These accomplishments would not be possible without our dedicated faculty, staff, students, and alumni. Guided by the clear-eyed stewardship of our District Board of Trustees, we remain steadfast on our journey to becoming the *#1 destination for academic excellence*.

Broward College powers South Florida's economy. This year's Annual Report highlights a powerful truth: the College is a dominant economic engine for South Florida. We don't just educate students; we transform lives by producing job-ready graduates prepared to immediately step into high-demand, high-wage fields like healthcare, information technology, aviation, and law enforcement. We design our Pathways to meet the immediate talent needs of our regional employers while providing our students with a launchpad for generational success. Our institutional impact is validated by the findings of our recent comprehensive study by Lightcast. During the 2023–24 fiscal period, Broward College delivered a staggering \$2.4 billion economic impact for Broward County. Through our operations, student spending, and highly skilled alumni, the College supports 25,621 local jobs—meaning one out of every 59 jobs in the county is directly connected to the College. Our immense macroeconomic power translates to

life-altering financial stability on an individual level. Students who complete their education at Broward College see an average increase in earnings of \$8,100 each year compared to those with a high school diploma. This reality reinforces that a Broward College education is one of the smartest investments an individual can make in their future, and one of the most reliable ways we strengthen local families and fuel our regional workforce.

Broward College is moving forward. Our recent collective accomplishments include securing a range of investments for long-term growth. Among these are an additional \$4 million in state PECO appropriations—for a total of \$38 million in funding to date—toward a new, state-of-the-art Health Science, Nursing, AI, and IT facility; a landmark \$4.1 million donation of two commercial jet engines and a \$1 million federal appropriation to strengthen our Aviation Institute; and a \$908,000 state grant from the Job Growth Grant Fund to expand the Aviation Maintenance Accelerated Express Program.

Achieving this level of excellence requires visionary leadership. This year, we were proud to strengthen our new executive alignment, welcoming senior management team leaders who embody our student-first mission. With the appointments of leaders like Dr. John Wensveen, Provost and Senior Vice President; Terry Mularkey, Vice President of Institutional Advancement and CEO of the Broward College Foundation; Jon Miller, Vice President of Government and Community Affairs; and Ben Rosenberg, General Counsel; alongside the promotion of Rabia Azhar to Chief Operating Officer and Senior Vice President, our leadership team is structurally equipped to scale our academic operations and deepen our regional impact.

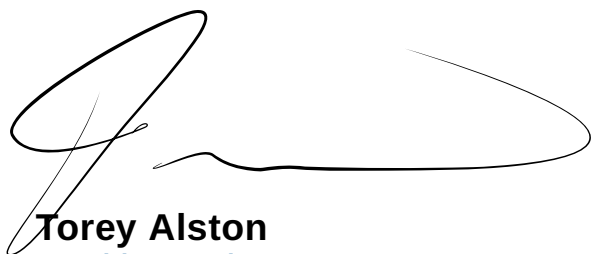
Broward College values community partnership.

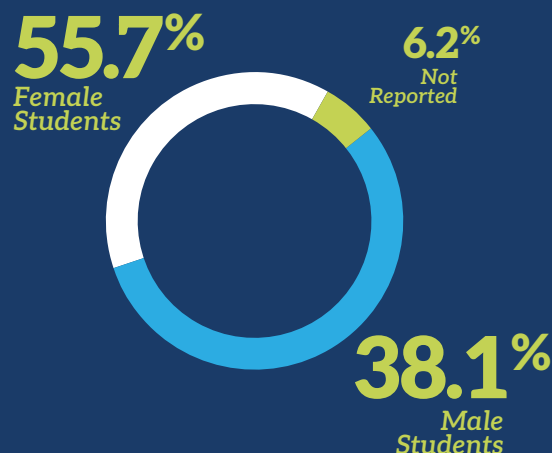

ECONOMIC IMPACT*

- Broward College creates a **positive net impact** on the county economy and generates a **positive return on investment** for students, taxpayers, and society.
- The College generated **\$2.4 billion in added income** for the local economy and supported **25,621 jobs** in 2023-24—meaning **one out of every 59 jobs** in the county is connected to Broward College, its students, and its alumni.
- Students who complete their education at Broward College see an **average increase in earnings of \$8,100 each year**.
- Broward College students will receive a present value of **\$1.2 billion in increased earnings over their working lives**, which translates to a return of \$5.50 in higher future earnings for every dollar that students invest in their education at the College.
- For every tax dollar spent educating Broward College students, taxpayers will receive an average of **\$2.80 in return** over the course of the students' working lives.
- Florida will receive an estimated present value of **\$6.2 billion in added state revenue** over the course of Broward College students' working lives.

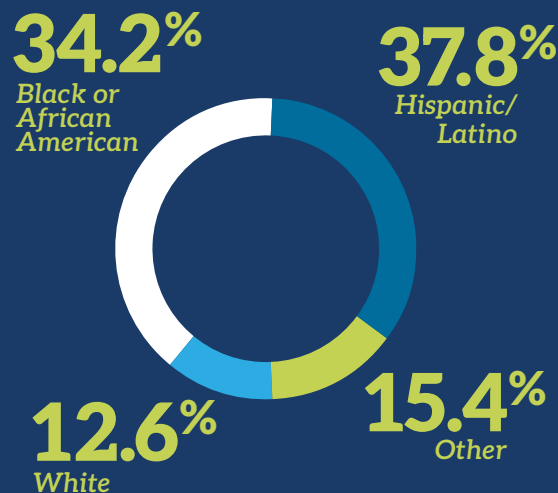
- The **only aviation program** in South Florida—and the first state college—to partner with JetBlue's Pilot Development Program.

- Broward College was designated as a **Florida Collegiate Purple Star Campus** for the first time ever by the Florida Department of Education. The program is part of Florida's commitment to be the most military-friendly state in the country.



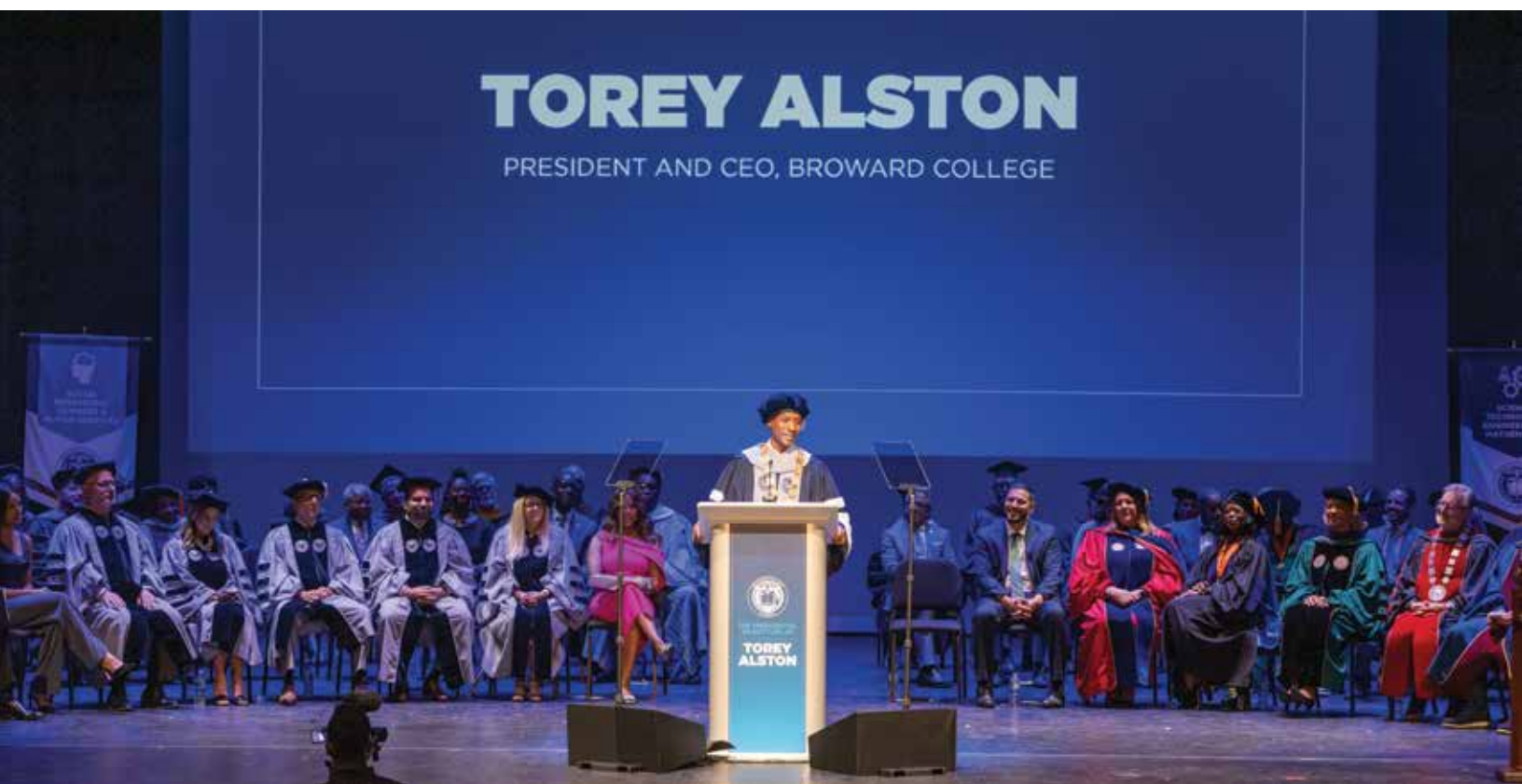

PRESIDENTIAL INVESTITURE: **OUR 8TH PRESIDENT**

In September 2025, Broward College celebrated both its 66th anniversary and the investiture of Torey Alston as its eighth President and CEO. Investiture ceremonies have a long tradition dating back to the Middle Ages, and the College honored that tradition with a processional featuring participants in full academic regalia. A variety of elected officials and education representatives served as guest speakers. Elected officials included U.S. Rep. Jared Moskowitz and Broward County Commissioner Michael Udine. Moskowitz, who served on the County Commission

with Alston in 2022, marked the occasion with the gift of a flag that was flown at the U.S. Capitol. Udine announced that the County Commission issued a proclamation declaring September 5th as “Torey Alston Appreciation Day.” Guest speakers from the education sphere included Florida Education Commissioner Anastasios Kamoutsas, Miami Dade College President Madeline Pumariega, Florida A&M University President Marva Johnson and Broward Schools Superintendent Howard Hepburn.

NEW EXECUTIVE APPOINTMENTS



BEN ROSENBERG

In May 2026, Ben Rosenberg joined Broward College as General Counsel. He previously worked at the University of Miami, where he led the drafting and negotiation of high-impact agreements spanning technology and data use,

sponsored research, and institutional operations. Earlier, he practiced law at an international law firm and as a network attorney. He earned his Juris Doctor from Florida International University and a Bachelor of Business Administration in Management and International Business from FIU.



JOHN WENSVEEN

John Wensveen joined Broward College in June 2026 as Provost and Senior Vice President. Most recently, he served as President of the International Space University. He previously served as Chief Innovation Officer at Nova Southeastern

University and Executive Director of the Alan B. Levan | NSU Broward Center of Innovation. He holds a Ph.D. and a master's degree in Business/Air Transportation Management from Cardiff University (United Kingdom).



RABIA AZHAR

Rabia Azhar, a longtime Broward College employee, was promoted in January 2026 to Chief Operating Officer and Senior Vice President after serving as Vice President of Finance and Administration and Chief Financial Officer. Her

background includes senior finance roles at the City University of New York's Brooklyn College and the International Rescue Committee. She holds a Bachelor of Business Administration from Pace University and a Master of Business Administration from National American University.



TERRY MULARKEY

Terry Mularkey joined Broward College in January 2026 as the Vice President of Advancement and CEO of the Broward College Foundation after serving 11 years at Nova Southeastern University, most recently as Vice President for University

Advancement and Chief of Staff. Previously, he served for 21 years in the U.S. Army, retiring with a rank of lieutenant colonel. He is a graduate of Mercer University, the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, and the Armed Forces Staff College. He earned a Master of Aeronautical Science from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University.



JON MILLER

In May 2026, Jon Miller joined Broward College as Vice President of Government and Community Affairs. He has 25 years of experience in advocacy and public affairs, including lobbying at the state and federal levels. He previously

served as President and CEO of Victory Marketing and Communications. He earned a Master of Arts degree in Political Science from the University of Central Florida and a Bachelor of Science in Justice Studies/Pre-Law from Georgia Southern University.



SARA SHAYANIAN

Sara Shayanian joined Broward College in May 2026 as Associate Legal Counsel. She has experience in corporate law and transactional matters, including private equity, corporate governance, and mergers and acquisitions. She

previously served as an Associate Attorney at Winston & Strawn LLP and Greenberg Traurig LLP. She earned her Juris Doctor from the University of Pennsylvania and a Bachelor of Political Science from the University of Florida.



SCANNING BROWARD'S NIGHT SKY

After a six-year hiatus initiated by the COVID-19 pandemic, Broward College's Buehler Planetarium and Observatory officially reopened in 2026. The Planetarium is now run by Mark Bennett, who originally worked there in the early 1980s as a work-study student. Bennett became assistant director of the Buzz Aldrin Planetarium at the West Palm Beach Science Museum in 1983. Five years later, he joined the Miami Space Transit Planetarium and Frost Science Museum, serving in various roles for 37 years.

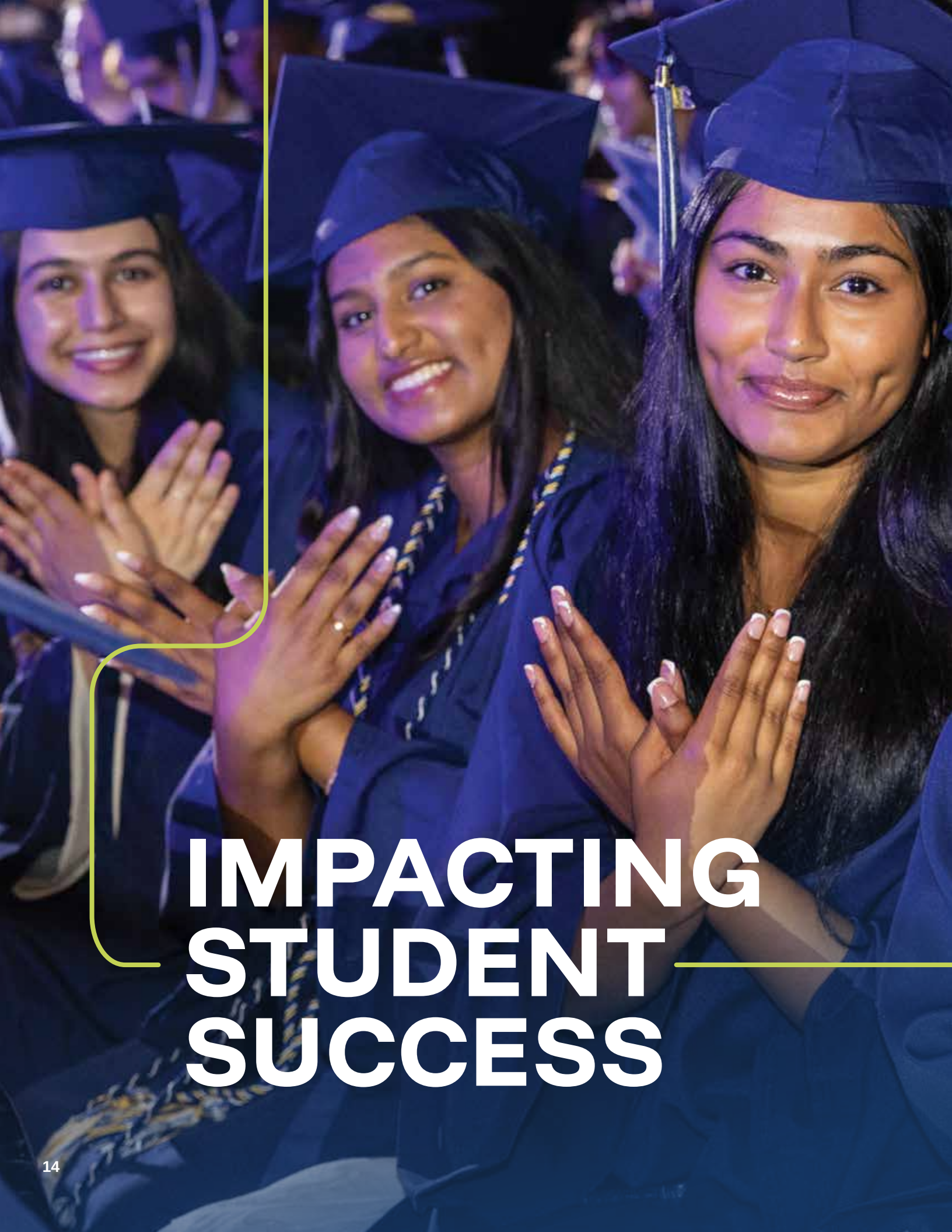
This year, the Planetarium's equipment has been upgraded with enhanced 4K laser projection and Digital Sky Dark Matter software that utilizes real-time internet data. The Planetarium has hosted multiple events since its reopening, such as a watch party for the landing of the capsule from NASA's historic Artemis II mission that sent astronauts back to lunar orbit.

STUDENT RECOGNITION

Broward College's accomplished students have earned various achievements that demonstrate their knowledge, dedication, and passion.



- Two Broward College Graphic Design students won National Student Gold and Silver ADDY Awards at the annual American Advertising Awards' National Awards Gala in Austin, TX. Maria Virginia Herrera won a Gold ADDY for the "Moody Cats" campaign and Iliana Jazel Maristela a Silver ADDY for the "Melt" special event materials. Broward College students previously won Silver awards at the local level in March and Gold awards at the district level in April.
- For the second consecutive year, *Panku*, the College's student-produced art and literary magazine, was honored by the National Council of Teachers of English's Recognizing Excellence

in Art and Literary Magazines (REALM) program. In January, the magazine was ranked "Superior" out of 456 schools from 44 states plus Washington, D.C., and six countries.

- Business for the Arts Broward (BFA) awarded a \$1,000 scholarship to art student Eden Vega after visiting a student exhibition at A. Hugh Adams Central Campus. BFA then displayed the entire student exhibit at their downtown Fort Lauderdale headquarters.
- Two teams of College Academy students won Best First Time Hacker and Best Honorable Mention at the College's 10th annual PlutoHacks 24-hour hackathon at Central Campus.

NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR GROWTH

In 2025-2026, the College expanded opportunities to prepare students for high-demand careers and to support academic success. This included launching new workforce-focused programs, enhancing hands-on learning experiences that support students from the classroom to their desired careers, supporting high-achieving students, and connecting students to universities through the 2+2 transfer opportunities.

NEW PROGRAMS

As workforce needs evolve, Broward College continues to introduce programs aligned with emerging industries and community demand.

The new Artificial Intelligence Practitioner Technical Certificate prepares students with foundational skills in artificial intelligence, machine learning, automation, and data science through hands-on, real-world learning experiences.

The College also launched a Computed Tomography Advanced Technical Certificate designed for credentialed Radiologic Technologists seeking advanced imaging specialization and preparation for the ARRT CT certification exam.

TECHNOLOGY ADVANCES STUDENT SUCCESS

In 2025-2026, Broward College continued to invest in technology that improves how students learn, connect, and move through their academic journey.

The College debuted a new Student Information System designed to replace a legacy platform and make key processes easier to navigate, including admissions, registration, financial aid, and graduation tracking. This included the launch of a fully redesigned myBC, the College's student portal.

Across the College, classrooms were upgraded with high-definition cameras, ceiling microphones, wireless lavalier microphones, and smart podium monitors with digital whiteboard and annotation tools. Broward College also upgraded 657 classroom computers across 12 student labs and 8 laptop carts, in partnership with Student Outreach Services, distributed more than 900 loaner laptops to help students access the tools they need to succeed.

The College also expanded access to in-person technical support through Technology Support Centers at North, South, and Central campuses, giving students, faculty, and staff direct access to IT professionals for timely support.

To strengthen digital safety, Broward College continued to enhance its network infrastructure and cybersecurity efforts, including multifactor authentication, advanced threat detection and prevention systems, and cybersecurity awareness training for the College community.



REIMAGINING BUILDINGS 56 & 57

Broward College is re-envisioning Buildings 56 and 57 on North Campus as a state-of-the-art STEM, nursing, A.I. and engineering complex. This new facility will accommodate more students and include space for 10 science labs, four nursing labs, a health assessment lab, a cybersecurity lab, and other learning spaces. A combined \$42.4 million in state and local funding has been invested so far in the project.

JOB-READY GRADUATES

At Broward College, one of the strategies to ensure student success is to connect students with career opportunities through internships, employer partnerships, and workforce-readiness initiatives.

In the last year, thanks to the College's Employment Solutions team, 330 students were hired and 1,044 benefited from internships, resulting in a total of 1,374 career placement and experiential learning opportunities for students.

Students also strengthened their professional readiness, earning 560 Career Readiness Soft Skill Credentials focused on communication, leadership, professionalism, and problem-solving.

During the 2025 academic year, the College recorded 1,817 employer engagements, creating expanded opportunities for networking, internships, hiring, mentorship, and experiential learning.

Key partners include Disney, Fastenal, Core Construction, GA Telesis, Memorial Healthcare System, Parker Dewey, and Virtual Internships.

ENHANCING STUDENT LIFE

Through myriad programs, Broward College students can find connections, engagement, fun, and academic success. The College hosts hundreds of campus-wide events each year, helping students to build relationships, strengthen leadership and organizational skills, stay aligned with their academic and career goals, and improve their course success rate and retention rate.

Over the 2025–2026 academic year, the Student Life department hosted 396 events across all campuses, ranging from cultural celebrations and career workshops to civic engagement initiatives. Event attendance showed strong year-over-year growth, with more than 46,000 student participants, an increase of more than 7,400 attendees and 37% over the previous academic year.

- Grew intramural participation to 3,003 students, an 18% increase over the 2,540 participants in 2024–2025.

HONORS COLLEGE

SHOWCASING STUDENT SUCCESS

The Robert “Bob” Elmore Honors College provided academic experiences, leadership opportunities, and transfer pathways for some of the institution’s high-achieving students during the 2025-2026 academic year. Approximately 1,500 students participated in Honors programs, including Dual Enrollment and College Academy students.

Honors students showcased their academic research at the Broward College Research Showcase 2.0, held at the A. Hugh Adams Central Campus in April 2026.

Students also participated in a leadership and college tour experience featuring the University of Florida and the University of Central Florida.

In the last academic year, 16 College Academy Honors students received national scholarships. Among them, seven were named QuestBridge matches, eight were selected as Posse Scholars, and one was named a National Merit Scholar.

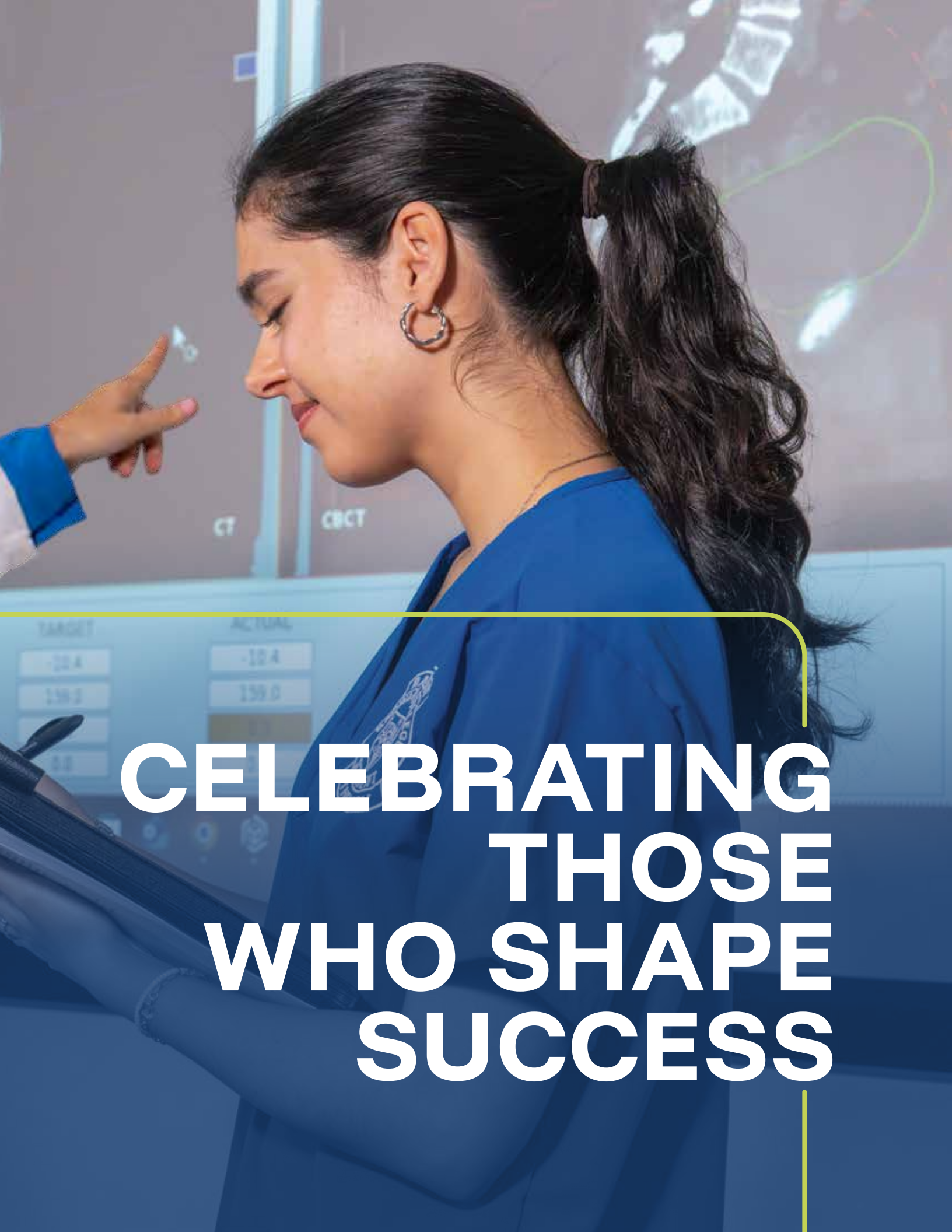

MAJOR HIGHLIGHTS OF THE FOUNDATION'S EFFORTS INCLUDE:

- The 38th Annual Broward College Golf Classic raised more than \$146,000 for the First Generation in College Scholarship.
- GA Telesis donated two massive Rolls-Royce Trent 800 jet engines, which are used in the Boeing 777 jetliner, and a jet engine stand valued at a combined \$4.1 million.
- \$120,000 was donated by the Norman and Henry Obermaier Charitable Trust to support Theatre programming.
