Grand Opening Celebrations

HEALTH SCIENCES SIMULATION CENTER

A standing-room only audience of College and community leaders turned out for the grand opening of Broward College's new state-of-the-art Health Sciences Simulation Center at the A. Hugh Adams Central Campus last month.

The three-story, 32,000-square-foot center is designed to provide a hospital-like setting with computerized "manikins" that provide real-life simulated clinical experiences students would encounter at an acute-care facility. The manikins can be programmed to mimic specific symptoms of various



diseases and conditions for the students to diagnose and respond to. "Simulations are healthcare's new pedagogy, the new clinical design," said keynote speaker Dr. Pamela R. Jeffries, nursing professor and vice provost for digital initiatives at Johns Hopkins University School of Nursing in Baltimore.

The bottom floor of the center features the Dr. Michael A. Chizner Auditorium, three examination rooms, a cardiovascular suite, triage area, lunchroom and classrooms. The second floor features the mother and child-birthing suite, medical-surgical suite, adult and pediatric critical care suites, waiting rooms, debriefing rooms and offices. The third floor consists of classrooms.

The Health Sciences Simulation Center was designed by the architectural firm ACAI and built by Gerrits Construction, Inc. and D. Stephenson Construction, Inc.

MIRAMAR WEST CENTER

Hundreds gathered last month as President Armstrong and Florida International University President Mark Rosenburg joined students and South Campus President S. Sean Madison to cut the ribbon on Broward College's latest center — a joint venture with FIU.

Already serving hundreds of students this semester, course offerings focus on business, supply chain management, and global trade and logistics. A number of credit-for-prior learning options are available, as well as credit by examination. The facility is also home to a variety of FIU offerings, including undergraduate programs focusing on liberal arts, business and construction management, and graduate programs in business, engineering, education and public administration.

The 89,000-square-foot, four-story building was designed by Perkins+Will and built by Kaufman Lynn Construction.



Relay La Vida Soars for the Cure



President Honors Broward Brain Bowler

Yudewitz is the first Broward College student to receive the award. Broward College is a powerhouse in the Brain Bowl, an academic quiz competition modeled after the "General Electric College Bowl," a television competition than ran from 1959 to 1970. Brain Bowl started in Florida's community colleges in 1982 and Broward won FCSAA state titles in 1989-93 and 1997-98. Broward teams finished as runners-up in 1986, 1997, 2006 and 2014 and team members are looking ahead to the 2015 state championships, which will be held March 12-14, 2015 at Pasco-Hernando State College's Porter Campus.
