Dental Students and Faculty 'Give Kids a Smile'

Broward College dental hygiene and dental assisting program students and faculty worked with other local volunteers last month to host Give Kids a Smile — a day of free dental care for underprivileged children — at the College's dental clinic, located at A. Hugh Adams Central Campus in Davie.



More than 80 patients received services, including cleanings, examinations, extractions, fillings, fluoride treatments, oral hygiene instruction, sealants and x-rays. Timmy the Tooth and local volunteer dentists, worked with faculty and students and even a few high-school students.

The Broward College dental hygiene program boasts a 94 percent pass rate for the 2014 graduates on the National Board of Dental Hygiene Examination and the dental assisting program had a 92 percent pass rate on the Dental Assisting National Board for its 2014 graduates. Both programs are accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation.



Brain Bowl Team Places Third in Nation



Broward College's Brain Bowl team consisting of Noah Yudewitz, Nicholas Lee Yee, Michelle Thackeray, Masekela Mandela and Jason Zelonka, finished in third place nationwide among community colleges at the National Academic Quiz Tournament's Community College Championship Tournament in February at Atlanta, Ga.

Broward's team is comprised of one Broward College student and four students who are dually enrolled at the College Academy at Broward College. Yudewitz placed second in the individual competition nationwide. A total of 116 scholars competed in the tournament.

The Brain Bowl competition, based on the format of the General Electric "College Bowl" radio and television series that aired from 1959-1970, requires knowledge of academic subjects, current events and popular culture. The Seahawks move on to the Brain Bowl international tournament against teams from Harvard, Yale and Stanford, among others on March 27-28.

Student Nurses Take Skills to Ecuador



Dr. Linda Washington-Brown and Professor Claudia Sahagun recently accompanied nine Broward College student nurses to Ecuador, for work at Dr. Pedro Alban's Good Samaritan Clinic in an impoverished area of Guavas Province. The students worked with more than 300 patients, ranging in age from nine days to 100 years. They screened the residents for vision, hearing, nutrition, diabetes, hypertension and cavities and treated them for colds, fever, sore throats, motorcycle accidents, rashes, worms, head and body lice and infected wounds. Six of the students were in the RN-to-BSN program and three were in the AS program. The students also donated clothes, shoes, book bags, and medical supplies to two local hospitals.




