The series features three "Dinner at the Square" and three "Take Out Tuesday" events which feature guest speakers on topics ranging from affordable housing to euthanasia. Broward College Recognized for Serving Hispanics and Minorities

The Department of Education has listed Broward College as one of the leading institutions for Hispanics in the United States. The College was ranked 16th in the 'Top 100 Colleges and Universities for Total Enrollment – Most Hispanic' in the August issue of *Hispanic Outlook* (HO) magazine. The publication releases a Top 100 Colleges and Universities for Hispanics issue each year, and highlights several lists from the Department of Education.



For the second consecutive year, a special report in *Diverse Issues in Higher Education* ranked Broward College third among public, for-profit and non-profit institutions nationwide in conferring associate degrees to minority students. Within that total, the College was second in the nation for the number of associate degrees conferred to African Americans and fifth for the number of associate degrees conferred to Hispanic students.

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President Armstrong Attends Global Partnership Week at Shanghai Polytechnic University in China

For the fourth consecutive year, the College has been invited to participate in the Global Partnership Week hosted by its partner institution Shanghai Polytechnic University in China. President Armstrong gave a presentation on "Fostering Relationships between Education and the Economy," a strategy for which Broward College is well-known in the United States. More than 80 colleges and universities from 31 countries participated in the event.

While in China, President Armstrong visited other partner institutions in the region and met with new organizations and agencies working there. Among them, is the Chinese Aviation Flight University of China (CAFUC) in Chengdu, which recently sent its first class of students to study at the College's Aviation Institute. The President was accompanied by Rosey Yang-Krivak, district director for Global Education and Commerce.

Broward College Science Project Selected by NASA

A research project developed by Broward College science faculty has been selected for a mission aboard NASA's Blue Origins New Shepherd sRLV (suborbital reusable launch vehicle). The project, "Measurement of the Atmospheric Background in the Mesosphere as a Pre-cursor to Astronomical Observations" sets off during the first half of 2018 and marks the 20th anniversary of the first Broward College project to launch in space. It will study the abundance of hydroxide in the mesosphere. The effects of the gas on the planet and the atmosphere are not yet fully understood. Each year, NASA distributes a request for project proposals to accompany launches. Submissions are competitively reviewed for scientific relevance. For the Blue Origins New Shepherd sRLV launch Broward College partnered with Silicon Valley Space Center.

Congresswoman Wilson Meets with Academic Team

U.S. Congresswoman Frederica Wilson, District #24, met with representatives of the College's academic team on July 31 to introduce the "5000 Role Models of Excellence Program" which offers mentoring and educational guidance to minority male students. Founded by Wilson in 1993, the program focuses on middle and high school boys and offers them the opportunity to attend college. Three counties are already participating in the program – Miami Dade, Duval and Pinellas. There are plans for a partnership with the College in the future.




Florida College System Foundation Provides Additional Scholarship Funds

The Florida College System (FCS) Foundation contributed \$85,294 to support scholarships for the 2017-18 academic year. The money was handed over to the Broward College Foundation by Madeline Pumariega, chancellor of the Division of Florida Colleges, and George Platt, member of the Florida College System Foundation's board of directors and a distinguished alumnus of Broward College at a special reception on August 17. The scholarships will assist students who are pursuing their degrees in nursing and allied health and those who are the first in their family to attend college.

Broward College Foundation Receives Silver Award for Communication Initiative

The Council for Advancement and Support of Education named Broward College a silver winner of its 2017 Circle of Excellence awards program. The College was recognized for its American Dream Scholarship initiative in the Communications Program Improvement category. The judges thought communications around the scholarship exceeded all the identified goals. More than 700 higher education institutions, independent schools and nonprofits worldwide submitted 3,364 entries for consideration in nearly 100 categories. There were 366 awards: 118 bronze, 125 silver, 107 gold and 16 grand gold.

The Council for Advancement and Support of Education is one of the largest international associations of education institutions, serving 3,670 universities, colleges, schools and related organizations in more than 80 countries.

Pay-for-Performance Increase Approved

The Board of Trustees approved raises for the 2017 fiscal year for full-time, non-represented employees and those represented by the Federation of Public Employees. The increase of 2.25 percent will be applied as of July 1 to base salaries and paid retroactively in the September 29 payroll. Employees eligible for the Pay-for-Performance increase are those employed as of September 15, 2017, have a performance evaluation completed for 2017 (per HR policy 3.21) and have completed all mandatory compliance training.
