

Architecture Transfer Plan – Associate of Arts 1010

Career Pathway: Arts, Humanities, Communication & Design

Location(s): General Education courses for this transfer plan are offered at all BC locations. Architecture courses are offered at the Willis Holcombe Center.

Program Description: The Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree is designed for the student who plans to transfer to a Florida public university as a junior to complete a Bachelor's degree. A student who earns an A.A. degree from Broward College meets the lower division general education requirements of a Florida state university, but does not automatically meet the requirements for a particular major. This major requires more than 60 credits to transfer to a University. Credit hours above 60 may not be covered by financial aid.
