- Students must successfully meet the foreign language requirement as prescribed in the college's policies and procedures 6Hx2-4.22.
- Students must take ENC1101, ENC1102, and two additional writing credit courses (6 credits) to graduate. Students must take 3 credits of International/Intercultural coursework to graduate.
- Students who place into college level math may bypass STA 1001 and take any additional Speech (SPC) or Communication (COM) elective or preapproved pre-requisite for transfer/program.
- Students must take 3 credits of International/Intercultural coursework to graduate.
- ¹ Additional Requirements: FSU, FAU, FIU, etc. all require keyboard proficiency for music majors. Piano students are NOT required to take secondary piano. All other music students are required take secondary piano classes/lessons, which may not be covered by financial aid.
- **MGF1106 and MGF1107 require a prerequisite of MAT1033, STA1001, or placement by testing
- This is only a recommended course sequence. Classes are subject to change based on the transfer University. Please check with your [Academic Advisor](#) and/or University website to ensure you are enrolled in the correct classes.
