- Students must successfully meet the foreign language requirement as prescribed in the college’s policies and procedures 6Hx2-4.22.
- Students in the Associate of Arts degree program may be eligible to earn technical certificates during their course of study
- Students must take ENC1101, ENC1102, and two additional writing credit courses (6 credits) to graduate.
- Beginning Fall 2019, first-time in college students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy either through passing POS2041/AMH2020 or CLEP/AP.
- Students must take 3 credits of International/Intercultural coursework to graduate.
- Students who do not need to take MAT1033\* based on placement test score, must take an elective to earn the 3 required program credits. It is recommended that students take GEB2112. Students may choose from any ACG\*, BUL\*, BRC\*, CGS\*, ECO\*, FIN\*, GEB\*, MAN\*, MAR\*, MKA\*, MNA\*, OST\*, QMB\*, REE\*, RMI\*, TAX\* prefix course.
