

Career Pathway: Public Safety

Location(s): <u>Courses for this program are offered at all BC locations</u>. Program specific courses for this program are offered at the A. Hugh Adams Central Campus.

Program Entrance Requirements: HS Diploma or GED

Program Description: This program is designed for students who hope to work in the field of law enforcement as crime scene technicians and/or police service aides and/or law enforcement officers. The program provides students with the knowledge, skills and training necessary to perform quality work as a crime scene technician, including the collection, preservation, documentation and presentation of criminal evidence. Students will also learn about the criminal justice and criminal courts system. This AS degree does not qualify students for state certification as a law enforcement or corrections officer. To become certified as a corrections or law enforcement officer a student must complete a Florida state certified Basic Recruit Training Program (Police Academy or Corrections Academy). Recommended Course Sequence

Notes: All courses under the TC column are required to earn the Technical Certificate (TC) in Crime Scene. Students completing the AS degree will earn the TC and the AS upon completion if all applicable courses are taken. Some classes have pre-requisites that must be followed.

*Students are required to complete 6 credits of elective courses for the AS and 1 credit of elective courses for the TC. These listed courses are the recommended electives; however, students may choose electives from any college level course or any of the criminal justice elective options which include: CJC2000, CJE1300, CJE2170, CJE2400, DSC1002, DSC1006, DSC2590 and CJJ2001.

MAC1105C is a 5-credit course. Students who register for this course must see an advisor to discuss their academic plan.

Students who do not pass the Computer Competency Test are required to take CGS1060C as an elective.

E* One credit from this elective will go towards the TC.

This is only a recommended course sequence. Students are strongly encouraged to meet with an advisor to create a personalized educational plan.
