- Declared Architecture students MUST receive advising through the Architecture Program by e-mailing vpadep@broward.edu at the beginning of their studies.
- Many courses have specific pre-requisite and co-requisite requirements that must be followed sequentially. Students are encouraged to consult the Course Information for a detailed list of all requisite requirements.
- Students must take ENC1101 and ENC1102 as well as two additional writing credit courses (6 credits) to graduate.
- FIU, FAU, UF, FAMU & USF require the math courses listed in the program. Other Universities may require **Calculus with Analytical Geometry I** (MAC2311) instead of **Business Calculus** (MAC2233). Students should research the math requirement of their transfer university.
- If a student is not eligible for MAC1105 College Algebra, they will have to take MAC1105C, a 5-Credit course. Students who register for this course must see an advisor to discuss their academic plan.
- Architecture Design I** (ARC1301C) is currently only offered in the Fall & Spring semesters. **Architecture Design II** (ARC1302C) is currently only offered in the Spring and Summer semesters. **Architecture Design III** (ARC2303C) is currently only offered in the Fall semester. **Architecture Design IV** (ARC2304C) is currently only offered in the Spring semester.
- The Digital Literacy requirement must be met by either taking CGS1060C or testing out. To test out please contact the Testing Center by e-mailing testingservices@broward.edu. Declared Architecture Majors are recommended to test out of Digital Literacy to gain 3 elective credits for Architecture courses.
- Theory of Architecture** (ARC2201) and **Survey of Architectural History** (ARC1701) count as writing credit courses. One of these courses will count as a Humanities credit.
- Students must take 3 credits of International/Intercultural coursework to graduate. **Theory of Architecture** (ARC2201) and **Survey of Architectural History** (ARC1701) satisfy the International/Intercultural requirement.
- Beginning Fall 2019, first-time in college students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy either through passing POS2041/AMH2020 or CLEP/AP.
- Core Humanities: **Art Appreciation** (ARH2000), **Intro to Literature** (LIT2000), **Music Appreciation** (MUL2010), **Intro to Philosophy** (PHI2010), **Theatre Appreciation** (THE2000), **Intro to Humanities** (HUM1020).
- Physics Lab (PHY1001L) is an optional elective-credit course. Please see advisor.
- Students must successfully meet the foreign language requirement as prescribed in the college's policies and procedures 6Hx2-4.22.
