



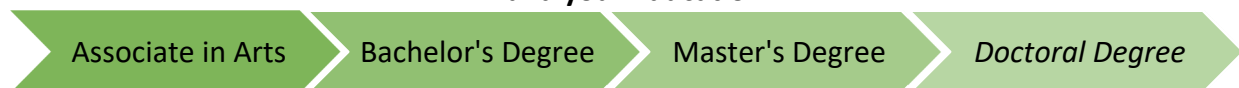
Music Transfer Plan – Associate of Arts 1010

- The National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) accredits Broward College. Declared music students MUST submit to an audition and advising process through the Visual & Performing Arts (V&PA) Department by calling 954-201-6843 or e-mailing vpadept@broward.edu at the beginning of their studies. Students who declare music as a major and have auditioned but cannot pass a music theory placement test, MUST take **Fundamentals of Music** (MUT1001).
- Financial Aid covers the first 24 elective credits under the Associates in Arts Degree. All Music courses fall under the electives category. **Music History I** (MUH2111) or **Music History II** (MUH2112) count as a Humanities credit.
- Additional Requirements: **FSU, FAU, FIU, etc.** all require keyboard proficiency for music majors. Piano Major students are NOT required to take secondary piano. All other music students are required to take secondary piano classes/lessons. These four semesters of piano prepare the student to pass the proficiency exam.
- All MVXXXXX and most MUNXXXX courses are restricted classes and must be registered with the V&PA Department each term.
- Students must successfully meet the foreign language requirement as prescribed in the college catalog. Vocal Performance students are recommended to take either German, French or Italian as a foreign language as per NASM standards.
- Students must take ENC1101 and ENC1102 as well as two additional writing credit courses (6 credits) to graduate.
- Students must take 3 credits of International/Intercultural coursework to graduate. **Music History I** (MUH2111) and **Music History II** (MUH2112) are international/intercultural courses. **Music History I** is only offered in the Fall term and **Music History II** is only offered in the Spring term.
- The Digital Literacy requirement must be met by either taking CGS1060C or testing out. To test out please contact the Testing Center by e-mailing testingservices@broward.edu. Declared Music Majors are recommended to test out of Digital Literacy to gain 3 elective credits for Music courses.
- MGF1106 and MGF1107 are general education math courses that do not require prerequisites. MAC1105C is a 5-credit course. Students who register for this course must see an advisor to discuss their academic plan.
- Beginning Fall 2019, first-time in college students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy either through passing POS2041/AMH2020 or CLEP/AP.
- Core Humanities: Art Appreciation (ARH2000), Intro to Literature (LIT2000), Intro to Philosophy (PHI2010), Theatre Appreciation (THE2000), Intro to Humanities (HUM1020).

12. **Music Theory I** (MUT1111) is offered in Fall and Spring terms, **Music Theory II** (MUT1112) is offered in Spring and Summer terms, **Music Theory III** (MUT2116) is offered in Fall term and **Music Theory IV** (MUT2117) is offered in Spring term.
