1. Declared Philosophy students should seek advising at the beginning of their program. For further information, please contact the Humanities Department by calling 954-201-6517 or e-mailing vpadep@broward.edu.
2. Students must take ENC1101 and ENC1102 as well as two additional writing credit courses (6 credits) to graduate. **Introduction to Logic** (PHI1100), **Introduction to Philosophy** (PHI2010), and/or **Introduction to Ethics** (PHI2600) satisfy the writing credit requirements.
3. MGF1106 and MGF1107 are general education math courses that do not require prerequisites. MAC1105C is a 5-credit course. Students who register for this course must see an advisor to discuss their academic plan.
4. Beginning Fall 2019, first-time in college students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy either through passing POS2041/AMH2020 or CLEP/AP.
5. The Digital Literacy requirement must be met by successfully passing CGS1060C, testing out, or completing a Credit for Prior Learning. Students that test out are required to take an approved elective to earn the 3 credits. To test out please contact the Testing Center by e-mailing testingservices@broward.edu. Declared Philosophy Majors are recommended to test out of Digital Literacy to gain 3 elective credits.
6. Students must successfully meet the foreign language requirement as prescribed in the college catalog.
7. Students must take 3 credits of International/Intercultural coursework to graduate. **Introduction to Philosophy** (PHI2010) fulfills the International/Intercultural requirement.

This is only a recommended course sequence. Classes are subject to change based on the transfer University. Please check with your [Academic Advisor](#) and/or University website to ensure you are enrolled in the correct classes.
