1. Declared Religious Studies students should seek advising at the beginning of their program. For further information, please contact the Humanities Department by calling 954-201-6517 or e-mailing vpadep@broward.edu.
2. Students must take ENC1101 and ENC1102 as well as two additional writing credit courses (6 credits) to graduate. **Introduction to Religion** (REL2000) and **Introduction to World Religion** (REL2300) satisfy the writing credit requirements.
3. The Digital Literacy requirement must be met by successfully passing CGS1060C, testing out, or completing a Credit for Prior Learning. Students that test out are required to take an approved elective to earn the 3 credits. To test out please contact the Testing Center by e-mailing testingservices@broward.edu. Declared Religious Studies Majors are recommended to test out of Computer and Internet Literacy to gain 3 elective credits.
4. MGF1106 and MGF1107 are general education math courses that do not require prerequisites. MAC1105C is a 5-credit course. Students who register for this course must see an advisor to discuss their academic plan.
5. Students must successfully meet the foreign language requirement as prescribed in the college's policies and procedures 6Hx2-4.22.
6. Beginning Fall 2019, first-time in college students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy either through passing POS2041/AMH2020 or CLEP/AP.
7. Students must take 3 credits of International/Intercultural coursework to graduate. Either **Introduction to Religion** (REL2000) or **Introduction to World Religion** (REL2300) fulfills the International/Intercultural requirement.

This is only a *recommended* course sequence. Classes are subject to change based on the transfer university. Please check with your [Academic Advisor](#) and/or university website to ensure you are enrolled in the correct classes.
