- The National Association of Schools of Theatre (NAST) accredits Broward College. Declared Theatre students MUST receive advising in the Theatre Department by contacting Theatre@broward.edu at the beginning of their studies.
- Financial Aid covers the first 24 elective credits under the Associate of Arts Degree. All Theatre courses fall under the electives category. **Theatre Appreciation** (THE2000) and **Script Analysis** (THE2300) count as Humanities credits.
- Students must take ENC1101 and ENC1102 as well as two additional writing credit courses (6 credits) to graduate. **Theatre Appreciation** (THE2000) and **Script Analysis** (THE2300) satisfy the writing credit requirements.
- The Digital Literacy requirement must be met by successfully passing CGS1060C, testing out, or completing a Credit for Prior Learning. Students that test out are required to take an approved elective to earn the 3 credits. To test out please contact the Testing Center by e-mailing testingservices@broward.edu. Declared Theatre Majors are recommended to test out of Digital Literacy to gain 3 elective credits for Theatre courses.
- Performance I, II, and III** (TPP1190L, TPP1191L, and TPP1192L) are restricted classes consisting of performance in a Theatre production. Students must audition for admittance to these classes. For information on audition notices please e-mail Theatre@broward.edu.
- Students must successfully meet the foreign language requirement as prescribed in the college's policies and procedures 6Hx2-4.22. Students should confirm with an academic advisor if they have fulfilled the foreign language requirement.
- Students must take 3 credits of International/Intercultural coursework to graduate. **Script Analysis** (THE2300) is an international/intercultural course.
- Beginning Fall 2019, first-time in college students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy either through passing POS2041/AMH2020 or CLEP/AP.
- MGF1106 and MGF1107 are general education math courses that do not require prerequisites. MAC1105C is a 5-credit course. Students who register for this course must see an advisor to discuss their academic plan.
