

Bachelor of Applied Science in Supervision & Management-T100

CAREER PATHWAY: BUSINESS

Location(s): Courses for this program are offered at all BC locations. Certain specialization courses may be offered at designated locations.

Program Description: The Bachelor of Science Degree in Supervision and Management prepares students to assume managerial roles in the public and private sectors. The program provides knowledge and skills in the areas of management, marketing, finance, operations, and strategy. Visit the program's website for more information.

Program Entrance Requirements: The Bachelor of Applied Science is an open access program designed for students who have earned an Associate of Science or an Associate of Arts degree and wishes to advance professionally. Students who have completed 60 lower level division credits will also be considered for admission. Students accepted into the BAS program in this category will need to see an advisor for an individual educational plan.

General admission to Broward College is required in addition to a supplemental application to the BAS program. Applicants for the BAS program should have completed a minimum of 15 semester hours of general education requirements as part of their AS degree. The remaining general education credits (totaling 36) will be completed during the Bachelor of Applied Science degree program. Applicants who have completed all general education hours through an earned AA degree, will complete additional lower level business courses. The BAS degree in Supervision and Management builds upon an associate degree in a business-related field. Students who have earned an AS in a non-business-related field must take additional lower-level business courses.

Graduation Requirements: The Bachelor of Applied Science degree will be awarded to students who meet the following requirements:

- A minimum of 120 semester credit hours in the prescribed coursework comprised of both lower division (AA or AS) and upper division (BAS) credit hours.
- Successful completion of the Capstone course.
- An overall GPA of 2.0.

The State of Florida sets forth the following BAS graduation requirements:

- Satisfy all General Education credits. The amount and area will vary.
- Meet the foreign language requirement.
- Complete two college level math courses.
 - a. STA2023 and MAC1105/MAC1105C are recommended.
 - b. MAC1105C is a 5-credit course. Students who register for this course must see an advisor to discuss their academic plan.
 - c. If students have taken both MGF1106 and MGF1107 as part of their AS/AA degree programs, QMB2100 is required.

Additional Program Information: Students interested in applying for the Bachelor of Applied Science in Supervision and Management who did not earn an Associate of Science degree in a business-related field must meet the following program competencies in addition to the BAS required courses:

- ACG2001 Principles of Accounting I
- ACG2011 Principles of Accounting II
- GEB1011 Introduction to Business
- ECO2013 Principles of Macroeconomics
- MAN2021 Introduction to Management
- MAR1011 Introduction to Marketing
- QMB2001 Business Statistics

Students may be able to complete these requirements as part of their upper division coursework.
