Program Entrance Requirements: HS Diploma or GED

Program Description: The Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree is designed for the student who plans to transition to Broward College's Bachelor of Science in Biology Education (2+2) or transfer to a Florida public university as a junior to complete a Bachelor's degree in Biology Education. A student who earns an A.A. degree from Broward College meets the lower division general education requirements of a Florida state university, but does not automatically meet the requirements for a particular major.
