CAREER PATHWAY: PUBLIC SAFETY

Location(s): Courses for this program are offered at all BC locations. Program specific courses for this program are offered at the A. Hugh Adams Central Campus. The specific polygraph courses are offered through a private training school, the International Academy of the Polygraph (IAP) at Deception Control, Inc., Fort Lauderdale.

Program Entrance Requirements: HS Diploma or GED

Program Description: The AS degree in Criminal Justice-Polygraph Emphasis is designed for students who hope to work in the field of law enforcement, corrections or public safety. The AS degree in Criminal Justice-Polygraph provides students with a valuable credential when applying for such jobs as police officer, corrections officer, state trooper/state officer, US Customs/Immigration inspector and community/police service aide or polygrapher. The AS degree does not qualify students for state certification as a law enforcement or corrections officer. To become certified as a corrections or law enforcement officer a student must complete a Florida state certified Basic Recruit Training Program (Police Academy or Corrections Academy).

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Notes: *Students are required to complete 6 credits of elective courses for the AS. These listed courses are the recommended electives; however, students may choose electives from any college level course or any of the criminal justice elective options which include: CJC2000, CJE1300, CJE2170, CJE2400, DSC1002, DSC1006, DSC2590 and CJJ2001. Students may have to take MAC1105C based on placement score. If the student needs this course, then 2 credits from this course may be utilized as an elective. Students who do not pass the Computer Competency Test are required to take CGS1060C as an elective.

This is only a <u>recommended</u> course sequence. Students are strongly encouraged to meet with an <u>advisor</u> to create a personalized educational plan. Students that anticipate transferring to FAU's School of Criminology and Criminal Justice program, should take two foreign language courses for their electives due to the program's foreign language requirements. Students do have the option of taking CLEP exams for the foreign language courses. Should students not take two foreign language courses or take CLEP exams for those courses, then students who have completed their A.A. or A.S. that transfer into FAU's School of Criminology and Criminal Justice program will have to take the two foreign language courses at FAU which will be in addition to the 60 credits needed to complete their bachelor's.
