



## History Transfer Plan – Associate of Arts 1010

**Program Description:** The Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree is designed for the student who plans to transfer to a Florida public university as a junior to complete a Bachelor's degree. A student who earns an A.A. degree from Broward College meets the lower division general education requirements of a Florida state university, but does not automatically meet the requirements for a particular major. Students seeking admission to FAU or FIU are strongly encouraged to earn "C" or higher in [second semester foreign language course](#) (i.e. credit for Spanish II or higher II or high). Alternatives are CLEP tests in French, English, Spanish, AP language courses, etc. It is recommended that this requirement be fulfilled before transferring to FAU or FIU if time permits.
