

PATROL RIFLE INSTRUCTOR COURSE - 3024

Course Description: This 32-hour course is required for CJSTC certification as a Patrol Rifle Instructor. This course prepares an instructor student to obtain Commission certification as a high-liability instructor in rifle and instruct the Patrol Rifle Operator Course and the Patrol Rifle Instructor Course. Topics include Course Introduction & Certification, Use of Force & Deadly Force, Instructor Techniques, Zeroing and Mechanical Offset, Patrol Rifle Operator Course Curriculum, Patrol Rifle Operator Evaluation and Remediation, and Student Teaching Exercise.

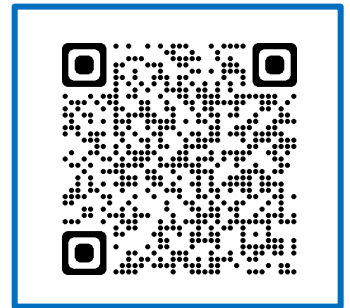
Participants must furnish a patrol rifle with weapon mounted light and alternate sighting system (micro red dot, laser, or iron sights), duty pistol with duty belt, 1000 non-frangible Rifle rounds, 100 non-frangible Pistol rounds, three 30-round Rifle magazines. Rifle plate is suggested.

It is highly recommended that you practice the 31-round qualification course as it is mandatory that you pass it at the beginning of this course. Gun handling skills should be at an advanced level; the drills and qualifications in this course are not beginner level. Please log into FDLE to view the curriculum and familiarize yourself with the curriculum and courses of fire.

Prerequisite: Completion of the Florida General Instructor Techniques Course – 1168 and Handgun Instructor Course - 801.

Course Objectives: At the end of this program, students should be able to:

- Learn the qualification and requirements to become a Commission-certified patrol rifle instructor.
- Learn the laws related to use of force and deadly force.
- learn the responsibilities and techniques for training students to effectively use a patrol rifle.
- Learn how to zero a rifle and understand the effect of mechanical offset.
- Learn the Patrol Rifle Operator Course text.
- Learn the various courses of fire and qualification requirements for the Patrol Rifle Operator Course.
- Students will demonstrate and carry out live fire exercises as well as identify and correct shooter deficiencies while acting as a line instructor.



Who Should Attend:

- Firearms instructors that will teach Patrol Rifle Operator Course and Patrol Rifle Instructor Course at their agency or a criminal justice training center.

End of Course Examination: CJSTC Rule 11B35.001 10(b): A student enrolled in a Specialized Instructor Training Course shall achieve a score of no less than 85% on the written end-of-course examination, exclusive of demonstration of any proficiency skills.

Attendance: Attendance at the initial class is mandatory. All students must adhere to the attendance requirements of the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission and the Rules, Policies and Procedures of the Institute of Public Safety.

Dress Policy: Your department's authorized training uniform. Law enforcement personnel not in uniform that are carrying exposed firearms must display agency ID and/or badge at all times while on college property.
