## ADULT SEX CRIMES INVESTIGATION



**Course Description:** This 40 hour course will provide an overview of sex crimes investigation for the officer and investigator with limited experience in this area, and an understanding of the problematic, legal, investigative, and evidentiary aspects of sex crimes.

**Course Objectives:** At the end of this program, students should be able to:

- Know what offenses constitute a sex crime or are related to sex crimes and the statute of limitations for reporting sex crimes
- Develop an understanding of the prevalence of sex crimes and why they are under-reported
- Understand the legal rights of victims and the legal responsibilities of law enforcement officers when investigating sex crimes
- Understand the typology of sex offenders and victims and why certain victims are typically chosen by offenders
- Understand the responsibilities of the patrol officer when responding to reports of a sex crime
- Develop an understanding of how trauma affects the brain and the implications that has on relating to the victim and investigating the assault
- Understand how to identify and collect evidence during sex crime investigations
- Develop strategies for interviewing victims and suspects
- Understand the investigative procedures associated with known and unknown suspects
- Understand the key components to include in written reports for sex crimes
- Understand how to craft well-written reports to combat common defense strategies
