ANIMAL CRIMES INVESTIGATIONS FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS



Course Description: This eight-hour course is designed to introduce law enforcement officers to the different aspects of animal crimes and the investigations of these crimes. It is a practical course which will familiarize road officers/deputies and detectives with animal crimes and the investigation of these crimes.

Course Objectives: At the end of this program, students should be able to:

- Explain the Florida State Statutes regarding crimes against animals to include Cruelty to Animals, Confinement of Animals, Animals Offered for Sale, Sexual Activities with Animals and Fighting/Baiting Animals.
- Determine the difference between misdemeanor and felony crimes against animals.
- Understand the investigative process regarding crimes against animals
- Discuss what paraphernalia and terminology is associated with Fighting/Baiting Animals
- Identify the aspects and rules of dogfighting and cockfighting
- Demonstrate knowledge of determining crimes against animals as opposed to ethical considerations
- Describe the collection of evidence regarding crimes against animals
- Investigate and complete a through report regarding the animal crime being investigated
- Present a complete case filing package for purposes of prosecution

- Patrol officers
- Detectives
