CRIMINAL LAW



Course Description: This course will update the officer's knowledge of Florida criminal law. Discussions will include the most recent statutes and case law on topics such as arrest, search and seizure, interrogations and confessions, rules of evidence and crimes against person and property. Participants should bring laptop to class.

Course Objectives: At the end of this program, students should be able to:

- Describe the legal defenses to crime
- List the sentencing options of a judge
- Explain the different ways an officer may arrest without a warrant
- Describe the procedure for obtaining an arrest warrant
- Explain the plain view doctrine



Who Should Attend:

- Law enforcement officers
- Correction Officers

Instructor: Gregg Rossman is a career prosecutor. He has been prosecuting major crimes for the Broward State Attorney's Office for more than 10 years.
