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FIELD TRAINING OFFICER COURSE FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS



Course Description: This 40-hour course is designed to introduce the officer to all aspects of field training and evaluation. Based upon the FDLE new CMS curriculum, it is a practical course requisite to assignment as a Field Training Officer and includes topics such as, CMS basic recruit training, role of the FTO, leadership and supervision, counseling techniques, and the evaluation process.

Course Objectives: At the end of this program, students should be able to:

- Define the goal of the FTO program
- List 5 primary roles of the FTO
- Explain the liability issues of the FTO
- Define leadership as it relates to FTO
- Demonstrate proper counseling techniques
- Understand the evaluation procedure
