

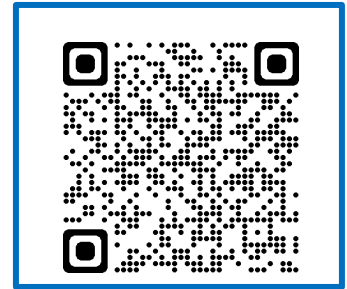
CMS FIRST AID INSTRUCTOR COURSE



Course Description: This 40-hour course is based on the premise that the primary objective of the criminal justice basic recruit First Aid instructor is to teach recruits their responsibilities for safe and effective response to an emergency medical situation. Instructor-students will be responsible for preparing and presenting a lesson from the CMS First Aid for Criminal Justice Officers Basic Recruit curriculum to include a practical exercise/scenario.

Course Objectives: At the end of this program, students should be able to:

- Identify the components of the Florida Basic Recruit Training Program
- Identify legal, ethical and liability issues associated with first aid training
- Demonstrate how to teach a lesson from the CMS First Aid for Criminal Justice Officer Basic Recruit Curriculum
- Demonstrate how to assemble and manage first aid practical and scenario exercises
- Demonstrate proper evaluation techniques of first aid practical and scenario exercises



Who Should Attend:

- Officers who wish to become First Aid Instructors
- Law Enforcement staff that will teach First Aid at their agency or a criminal justice training center

Instructors: Sergeant Franco Dillena (Ret.) retired from Miramar Police Department after 25 years of Service. Sgt Dillena holds multiple advanced and Instructor level certifications including First Aid, Firearms, SWAT, Underwater Search and Recovery, Police Vehicle Operations, Police Motorcycle Operations, Defensive Tactics, and Basic Life Support. Prior to his Law Enforcement Career Sgt Dillena served in the United States Marine Corps 5th Force Reconnaissance Battalion 3RD Marine Division as a Reconnaissance Marine Combatant Diver. Sergeant Dillena now serves Broward College Institute of Public Safety as the Vehicle Operations and First Aid coordinator.

Officer Joseph J. Mercogliano retired from the Plantation Police Department after over 30 years. He is the Past-President of the Fraternal Order of Police, Plantation Lodge #42 and has served on its Executive Board for over 10 years. He holds a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice/Public Administration from Nova Southeastern University and is currently an instructor with Broward College's Institute of Public Safety.

End of Course Examination: CJSTC Rule 11b35.001 9(b): A student enrolled in a Commission-approved Advanced or Specified Specialized Training Program Course shall achieve a score of no less than 80% on the written end-of course examination. A student enrolled in a Specialized Instructor Training Course shall achieve a score of no less than 85% on the written end-of-course examination, exclusive of demonstration of any proficiency skills.

Attendance: Attendance at the initial class is mandatory. All students must adhere to the attendance requirements of the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission and the Rules, Policies and Procedures of the Institute of Public Safety.

Dress Policy: Your department's authorized training uniform. Law enforcement personnel not in uniform that are carrying exposed firearms must prominently display agency ID and/or badge at all times while on college property.
