

Parking Enforcement Specialist for Civilians



Course Description: This 16 hour course is designed to teach participants to function in the position of a Parking Enforcement Specialist. Satisfactory completion of the course certifies participants under Florida Statute 316.640 as a Parking Enforcement Specialist and allows them to function within the guidelines of these statutes. The course is approved by and meets the requirements of the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission.

Course Objectives: At the end of this program, students should be able to:

- Explain F.S. 316.640
- Define arrest as defined in Black's Law Dictionary
- Define obstruction of justice
- Identify general radio procedures
- Identify the parts of a vehicle
- Define territorial jurisdiction

Who Should Attend:

- Police/Community Service Aides
- Other non-sworn employees with traffic investigation/control or parking enforcement responsibilities
- Individuals wishing to pursue careers as Parking Enforcement Specialists in the private sector

Fees: \$75 Agency checks payable to Broward College/IPS, credit/debit card, or money order. Cash and personal checks are not accepted.

End of Course Examination: CJSTC Rule 11b35.001 9(b): A student enrolled in a Commission-approved Advanced or Specified Specialized Training Program Course shall achieve a score of no less than 80% on the written end-of-course examination. A student enrolled in a Specialized Instructor Training Course shall achieve a score of no less than 85% on the written end-of-course examination, exclusive of demonstration of any proficiency skills.

Attendance: Attendance at the initial class is mandatory. All students must adhere to the attendance requirements of the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission and the Rules, Policies and Procedures of the Institute of Public Safety

Dress Policy: Your department's authorized training uniform. Slacks and a Polo-style shirt for students not yet with an agency. No shorts, tank-tops, muscle shirts, torn jeans, or flip-flops. Law enforcement personnel not in uniform that are carrying exposed firearms must prominently display agency ID and/or badge at all times while on college property.
