SUBSTANCE ABUSE AWARENESS AND EDUCATION



Course Description: This course provides a necessary overview of substance abuse awareness, substance abuse education and legal aspects, drug variations including narcotics, nicotine and alcohol, prescription and over-the-counter drugs, and substance abuse effects on society. This course also helps you to prepare a substance abuse awareness presentation for specific populations.

Course Objectives: At the end of this program, students should be able to:

- Understand the description of narcotics (opiates) including medical & slang names and definitions, types, and medical uses
- Understand the effects of narcotics on the body, the physical or behavioral indicators of abuse, dependency, and withdrawal symptoms
- Understand how to put an awareness presentation
