

Overview of EAP Program and Q & A

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English for Academic Purposes (EAP)

- The ideal option for degree-seeking students is the English for Academic Purposes (EAP) program, which offers English language courses that are **designed to prepare non-native speakers for a degree program at BC.**
- The EAP program consists of ten courses in **three main skill-areas:** Grammar & Writing, Listening & Speaking, and Reading & Vocabulary.
- Since the EAP program focuses on **developing academic-level proficiency**, prospective students should have at least some basic understanding of English prior to enrolling in courses.
- EAP courses offer developmental credits (and in some cases elective credits) geared towards preparing students for a degree.



English for Academic Purposes (EAP) Courses

GRAMMAR & COMPOSITION



EAP GRAMMAR/Writing I EAP 0185C (6 Credits)

Prerequisite: Through writing sample and/or department recommendation.

This beginning course addresses grammar skills, question formation, mechanics, and introduces sentence construction.

EAP GRAMMAR/Writing II EAP 0285C (6 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 0185C or Placement Based on Writing Sample
High-beginner course addresses basic grammar skills (e.g. verbs, modifiers, nouns, articles, pronouns, prepositions, articles, etc.), sentence construction, etc.

EAP GRAMMAR/Writing III EAP 0385C (6 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 0285C or placement Based on Writing Sample
Intermediate course focuses on sentence construction, question formation, mechanics, paragraph formation, etc.

EAP GRAMMAR/Writing IV EAP 0485C (6 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 0385C or placement Based on Writing Sample
High-intermediate course introduces paragraph writing and mastery of complex grammatical structures (e.g. modals, clauses, quotes & reported speech, etc.)

PHONETICS & COMMUNICATION



EAP LISTENING/SPEAKING I EAP 0100C (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: Through placement testing and/or department recommendation.
A beginning course designed to develop basic speaking & listening skills.
LOEP = 20-50

EAP LISTENING/SPEAKING II EAP 0200C (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 0100C
A high-beginning course designed to develop speaking and listening skills for the general academic environment.
LOEP = 51-70

EAP LISTENING/SPEAKING III EAP 0300C (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 0200C
Emphasizes the development of speaking and listening skills necessary for participating in classroom discussions.
LOEP = 71-85

EAP COMM. SKILLS IV EAP 0400C (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 0300C
Course guides students to apply pronunciation, phrasing, and intonation of U.S. American English to communication situations
LOEP = 86-100

READING



EAP READING I | EAP 0120C (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: placement / testing
This beginning course emphasizes vocabulary and basic comprehension.
LOEP = 20-59

EAP READING II | EAP 0220C (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 0120C
This high beginning course emphasizes vocabulary and basic comprehension.
LOEP = 60-74

EAP READING III | EAP 0320C (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 0220C
Intermediate course emphasizes vocabulary, critical comprehension & study skills
LOEP = 75-89

EAP READING IV | EAP 0420C (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 0320C
This high intermediate course emphasizes vocabulary, critical comprehension & study skills
LOEP = 90-113

Common Placement Test

EAP COMPOSITION 1 EAP 1540C (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 0485C
Strongly recommended: EAP 0400C /420C
A composition course that addresses mastery of paragraph writing, effective editing and an introduction to essay development are also addressed.

EAP COMPOSITION 2 EAP 1640C (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 1540C
An advanced composition course focuses on academic writing in multi-paragraph essays and effective editing; (e.g. essay tests, definition, persuasive, & research)

Eligibility for ENC 1101

To exempt EAP 1540/1640 and/or EAP 1520C and go directly to ENC 1101:

Common Placement Test Scores on Reading AND Writing MUST be ENC1101 Eligible:

Test	Reading Score	Writing Score
PERT	106 - 150	103 - 150
ACCUPLACER NG	245 - 300	245 - 300
ACT	19 - 30	17 - 30
SAT	24 - 40	25 - 40

- Placement into EAP is based on writing sample and LOEP scores
- All EAP courses require a passing grade of 'C' or higher.

Common Placement Test

EAP Advanced Reading EAP1520C (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: EAP 0420C
Strongly recommended: EAP 0400C /0485C
An advanced reading course that emphasizes critical comprehension and vocabulary skills.
LOEP = 114-120

EAP Testing Placement

- The LOEP and required WritePlacer ESL placement essay are used to assess students' English language skills for placement into appropriate EAP courses that will prepare them for the English language requirements of college-level courses.
- **LOEP cutoff scores:**
 - Listening Skills = 101+
 - Reading Skills = 114+
 - Writing: Based on Evaluation of Writing Sample
- The LOEP and required WritePlacer ESL may also be used to exempt students from EAP courses if students demonstrate proficiency by meeting minimum thresholds. Students who meet the thresholds will take the common placement test for placement into appropriate courses

Tips and Suggestions for EAP Instructors



Teaching Strategies

1. Establish Procedures

- *Set the tone on the first day of class: have focused activities to go over the syllabus, learning outcomes, and class policies – **English ONLY***
- Make proper introductions - expressing interest in the students' names and career goals.

2. Scaffolding

- Activate prior knowledge.
- Break up the learning into chunks in order to move students progressively toward stronger understanding in the learning process.

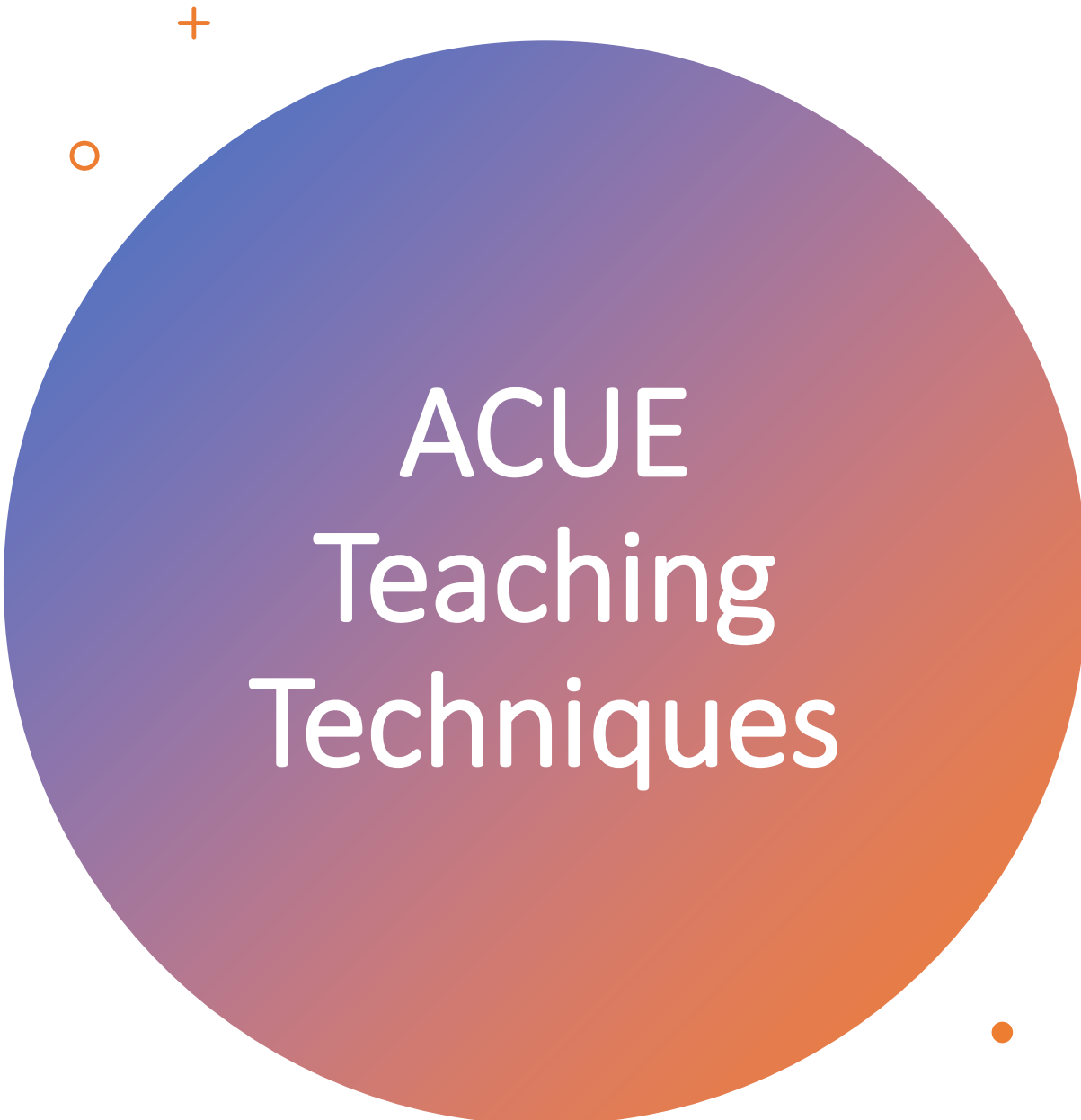
Teaching Strategies

3. Active Learning

- Students are actively or experientially involved in the learning process.
- Create opportunities for students to ask questions and clarifications about what is taught.
- Provide feedback
- Implement collaborative learning:
group work, role-plays, presentations, debates, and group projects

- Online Discussions
- Online Interactive Exercises
- Videos
- Recording
- Online Polls- Zoom, GetKahoot.com, Poll Everywhere.com, Mentimeter.com

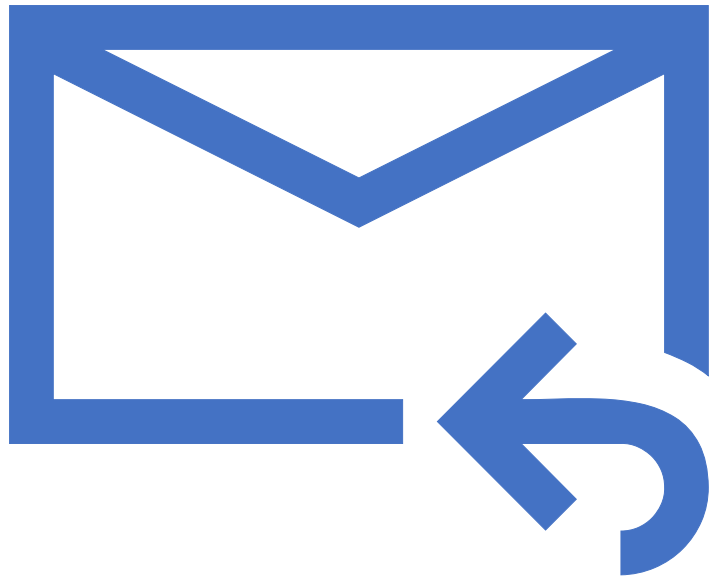
