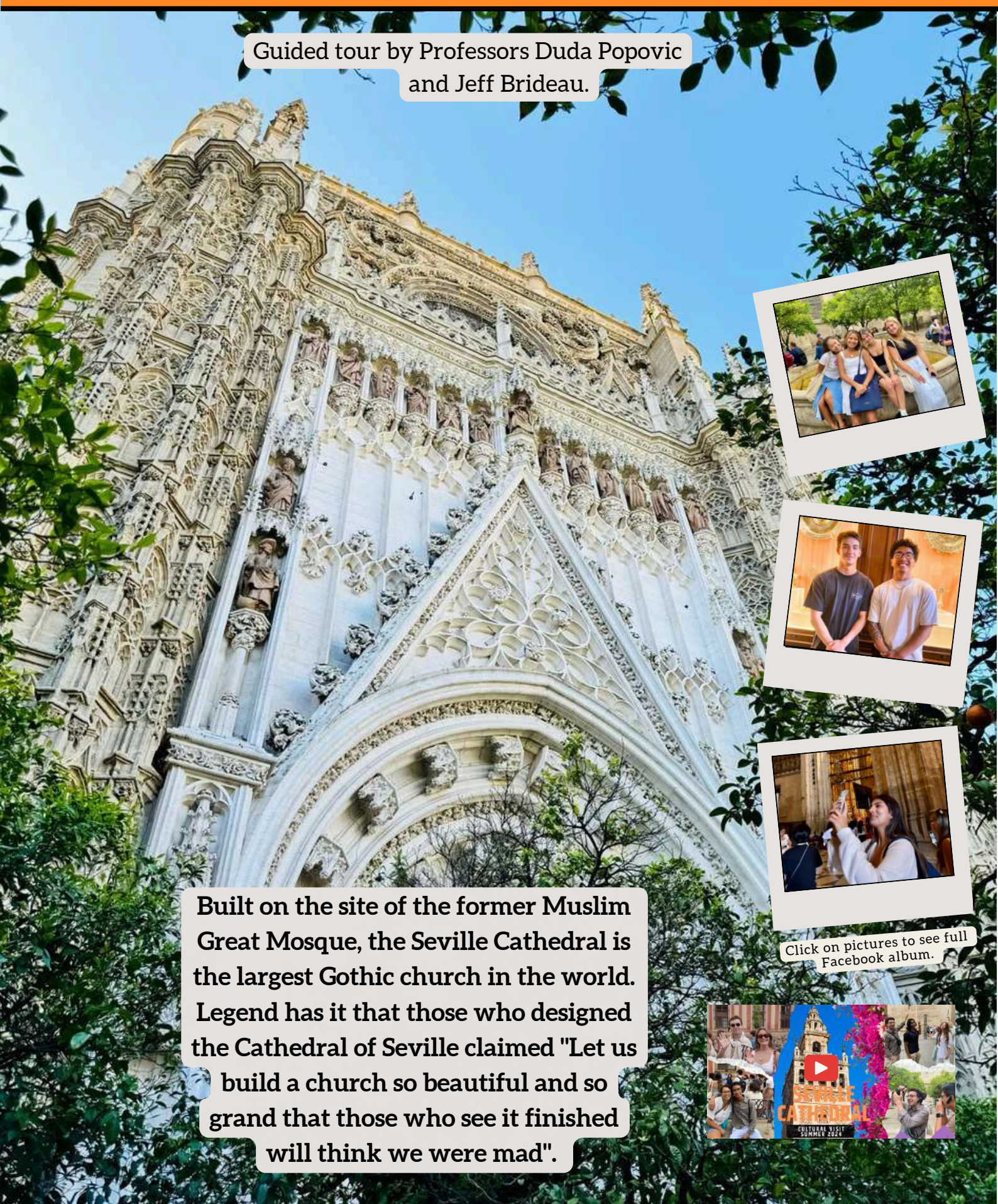


THE CATHEDRAL
