

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

This Articulation Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into as of _	May 13, 2019	by
The District Board of Trustees of Broward College, Florida ("College") locat	ed at 111 East Las Olas B	oulevard,
Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301, and The University of Gibraltar		
("Educational Instit	ution") (collectively, the	"Parties")
located at Europa Point Campus, Europa Point, Gibraltar, GX11 1AA		,
under the following terms until May 13, 2023		

This Agreement between the Parties is governed by Chapter 1007, Florida Statutes and the Rules of the State Board of Education. This is a no cost agreement to the College. The foregoing terms and conditions are made an integral part of this Agreement:

1. COURSES AND PROGRAMS.

The Educational Institution hereby agrees to accept from the College's graduates the courses and programs as described in the attached Exhibit "A."

2. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS.

The Parties shall be considered independent contractors and nothing in this Agreement shall be interpreted to establish any relationship other than that of an independent contractor between the Parties and their respective employees, agents, subcontractors or assigns, during or after the term of the Agreement.

3. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY.

Each Party shall be responsible for its own acts of negligence. Nothing herein shall be construed or interpreted as (1) denying either Party any remedy or defense available to such Party under the laws of the State of Florida; (2) the consent of the State of Florida or its agents and agencies to be sued; or (3) a waiver of sovereign immunity of the State of Florida beyond the waiver provided in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

4. NO THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARIES.

The Parties expressly acknowledge that it is not their intent to create or confer any rights or obligations in or upon any third-party person or entity under this Agreement.

5. NON-DISCRIMINATION.

The Parties to this Agreement shall not discriminate against any employee or participant regarding responsibilities and obligations under this Agreement because of race, age, religion, color, gender, national origin, marital status, disability, sexual orientation, or any other basis prohibited by law. Nor shall the Parties deny participation in or benefits arising out of this Agreement to any student, employee or participant or otherwise subject anyone to discrimination in any activity hereunder. The Parties shall take all measures necessary to effectuate these assurances.

6. AMENDMENTS.

This Agreement may be amended only when reduced to writing and signed by both Parties.

7. TERMINATION.

This Agreement may be terminated by either Party upon written notice to the other Party, given at least one full academic year in advance of such termination date.



8. RECORDS.

Each Party shall maintain its own respective records and documents associated with this Agreement in accordance with the records retention requirements applicable to public records. Each Party shall be responsible for compliance with any public documents' request served upon it pursuant to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, and any resultant award of attorney's fees for non-compliance with that law.

9. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS.

Each Party shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws, codes, rules and regulations in performing its duties, responsibilities and obligations pursuant to this Agreement.

10. GOVERNING LAW.

This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Florida. Any controversies or legal claims arising out of this Agreement and any action involving the enforcement or interpretation of any rights hereunder shall be submitted to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Florida.

11. ASSIGNMENT.

Neither Party to this Agreement shall assign, delegate or otherwise transfer its rights and obligations as set forth in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party. Any attempted assignment in whole or in part to this Agreement in violation of this provision shall be null and void.

12. ENTIRE AGREEMENT.

This Agreement states the entire understanding and agreement between the Parties and supersedes any and all written or oral representations, statements, negotiations, or agreements previously existing.

13. BINDING EFFECT.

This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

14. NOTICE.

When either of the Parties desire to give notice to the other, such notice must be in writing, sent by certified U.S. Mail. The Parties are responsible for notifying the other Party if there is a change of address or person(s) to be noticed. The Parties designate the following as the respective persons for receipt of notice:

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ARTICULATION AGREEMENT EXHIBIT "A"

To create a clear and easy pathway for all students of Broward College (BC) to transfer to and complete their bachelor's degrees at the University of Gibraltar this exhibit supplements the articulation agreement between Broward and the University of Gibraltar dated May 13, 2019. This agreement does not guarantee admission to the University of Gibraltar or to a specific program/major.

ARTICLE 1: STUDENTS

- 1. Upon satisfaction of all standard requirements for admission to a University of Gibraltar undergraduate program, the University of Gibraltar will accept BC students at first year undergraduate level status if they have completed coursework eligible for transfer to the University of Gibraltar. Transferring students must have earned credits that are considered acceptable in accordance with the Code of Practice for Credit Transfer and Recognition of Prior Learning, which will be made available on the University of Gibraltar website. Courses numbered lower than 100-level are not included in this transfer agreement. Depending on the program of study at the University of Gibraltar into which students are transferring there may be, for example, higher requirements or additional documentation required. General information on the University of Gibraltar transfer requirements may be obtained from: Student Experience Office christian.camilleri@unigib.edu.gi
- Official transcripts must be sent directly from the Broward College Registrar's Office to the University of Gibraltar Student Experience Office/ Office of Undergraduate Admissions.
 Transcripts can be sent electronically or prepared on official BC transcript paper and must be considered official by Broward College.
- 3. Students who complete two years of full-time coursework at an institution of higher education which uses English as its language of instruction, and complete the course equivalents of University of Gibraltar's English proficiency requirements will be deemed to have satisfied the English language proficiency requirements for admission to the University of Gibraltar. These students will not be required to submit additional documentation of English language proficiency (e.g. TOEFL or IELTS scores) at the time of application, however they may be required to undertake an application interview.
- 4. To fulfill the award requirement for undergraduate degrees, a minimum of 180 UK credits (36 semester credit hours) presented for the degree must be awarded by the University of Gibraltar.
- 5. Following successful completion of the program and meeting all of the University of Gibraltar's published degree and graduation requirements, the University of Gibraltar will award the student a bachelor's degree in the program selected.
- 6. Admission to the Program shall be without regard to race, sex, color, religion, sexual orientation, marital status, national origin, age, or beliefs. The University of Gibraltar does not discriminate on the



basis of race, color, national origin, ethnic origin, religion, creed, age, physical or mental disability, veteran status, uniformed service, political belief, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, pregnancy, marital status, genetic information, social or economic status, or whether the person is a smoker or nonsmoker, as long as the person complies with University policy concerning smoking.

- 7. All students admitted to the University of Gibraltar agree to abide by the regulations, rules, and statutes of the University of Gibraltar and its governmental entities.
- 8. Students transferring to the University of Gibraltar from BC will receive all services normally provided to the University of Gibraltar students and will have the same rights and responsibilities afforded to all the University of Gibraltar's students. This includes the ability to apply for all relevant scholarships.
- 9. Students transferring to the University of Gibraltar from BC will be responsible for normal University of Gibraltar tuition and fees and for transportation costs to and from the University of Gibraltar. Students are responsible for all costs incurred at the University of Gibraltar, those involving books, stationery, study materials and course-specific fees (e.g., costs of fieldwork or laboratory deposits). In addition, students will pay for their own accommodation (room and board) and living costs. Students are responsible for the costs of health and other insurance in line with current regulations at the University of Gibraltar, which may be changed from time to time by the University of Gibraltar. Students must comply with all health regulations, and visa or other residence requirements to the extent they may apply, in force in the University of Gibraltar at the time of matriculation.
- 10. The University of Gibraltar will accept up to 36 semester credit hours of transfer credit (180 UK credits) from BC. The University of Gibraltar will determine course equivalency for each course presented for transfer in accordance with its Code of Practice for Credit Transfer and Recognition of Prior Learning, which will be made available on the University of Gibraltar website.
- 11. The University of Gibraltar retains the final authority on all students' acceptance and credit transfer decisions.



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT EXHIBIT "B"

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

The purpose of this Exhibit "B" is to delineate any and all changes, deletions and/or additions to the Articulation Agreement. In the event of any conflict between this Exhibit "B" and any other provision specified in this Agreement, this Exhibit "B" shall take precedence.

14.NOTICE

When either of the Parties desire to give notice to the other, such notice must be in writing, sent by certified U.S. Mail or the equivalent if sent from outside the U.S.

15. ATTORNEYS FEES

In any action of or concerning this Agreement, if the College is the prevailing party, the College shall be entitled, and if the Educational Institution is the prevailing party, the Educational Institution shall be entitled, to an award of reasonable attorney's fees and costs through and including any appeals from the non-prevailing party.
