Academic Articulation Agreement

Broward College and Troy University

This Articulation Agreement between Broward College and Troy University (TROY) serves to identify the general education/general studies course that may be transferred from Broward to TROY. This agreement will foster inter-institutional cooperation and allow students of Broward to know in advance, which courses will transfer to a baccalaureate degree at TROY. This agreement will enter into effect on the date signed by both parties. This agreement may be terminated by either party giving written notice to the other party of intention to do so. Such notice of intention to terminate shall be given in writing to the other party no less than 30 days prior to termination date, unless both parties mutually agree, in writing, to a lesser period, but not to be earlier than the term in process. The following conditions must be met by Broward students wishing to transfer to TROY:

1. Both Broward and TROY must retain a good standing with the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC).
2. Upon completion of an Associate's degree from Broward, students must be officially admitted according to the admissions requirements as established by TROY.
3. Transfer students will be eligible for unconditional admission to TROY with a "C" average (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) on at least 24 semester hours of college work attempted excluding developmental courses.
4. Transfer credits from Broward will be accepted by TROY in accordance with the attached course transfer matrix. Transfer courses must have a grade of "C" or higher to be eligible for transfer.
5. Transferability of CLEP credit and advanced placement credit will be determined by TROY.
6. Transfer students must have a complete official transcript from Broward forwarded to the appropriate Troy University Admissions office.
7. The attached transfer matrix will have identified all Broward courses that will transfer for TROY courses.
8. All transfer students must earn a minimum of 25% of all degree program hours in residency at TROY in order to graduate from TROY with a Bachelor's degree.
9. All transfer students must earn a minimum of 50% of all degree program hours using traditional academic credit (excludes credit by exam, challenge exams, military experiential credit, etc.) in order to graduate from TROY with a Bachelor's degree.
10. Changes made by accrediting and other regulatory agencies such as the Alabama State Department of Education, Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACSCOC), NCATE, the Alabama Commission on Higher Education, the Florida Department of Education or any other state or accrediting agency could result in specific requirements being added to this agreement and must be agreed on by both parties.



11. Transfer students serving a suspension from Broward are eligible to apply for admission to TROY after serving the suspension period from Broward College. Students on disciplinary suspension must be eligible to return to Broward before being considered for admission to TROY.
12. TROY will provide students the opportunity to complete a baccalaureate level degree and above.
13. All Broward students who transfer prior to completion of their associate's degree and enroll at TROY will be evaluated annually for reverse transfer for the awarding of the Broward associate's degree.
14. The reverse transfer process will be handled through the National Student Clearinghouse, of which both parties will be members.
15. The TROY Office of the Registrar and the Records Office of Broward will evaluate the effectiveness of this process annually and recommend modification and changes to each other as needed.
16. In concert with the Broward Strategic Communication department the TROY Marketing Department will create marketing materials, print ads, and other media materials (the "Outreach Materials") to be used in outreach to local prospective students about the program and the benefits of earning a Broward associate's and TROY bachelor's degree.
17. Marketing materials will be shared and approved by both parties in advance. Pieces will not be degree specific.

The attached transfer matrix involving Broward and TROY courses will enable transfer student to have advanced information regarding guaranteed transferability.

These transfer listings are primarily based on academic catalogs since Fall 2005. Therefore, please understand that these listings are a culmination of TROY courses and transfer courses as of this current date. It is not necessarily a complete listing of all possible transfer courses from any one institution, although, the most common transfer institutions for TROY will display more extensive course listings. As requirements and course descriptions may change, this transferability information is subject to change at any time, without prior notification.

Students, advisors, and/or faculty/staff may all use these transfer pages to understand how course work from the listed institutions will be applied as TROY course work.

Students following an articulation agreement may not always see courses as listed on a specific agreement. Therefore, they should not use these transfer pages alone to determine the potential transfer credit award. The actual transfer/articulation agreement should be used as it will take priority in the official transfer credit evaluation, with the exception of courses ineligible for transfer due to specialized accreditation rules/regulations that may apply to specific majors.
